The Gilgit - Baltistan Finance Act - 2022 has been Published in the Gazette of Pakistan by the Competent Authority vide Registration No. M-302 / L. - 7646 Dated 26th July, 2022.



THE GILGIT-BALTISTAN FINANCE ACT-2022 (ACT NO. II OF 2022)

AN ACT

To give effect to the financial proposals of the Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) Government and to bring financial discipline during the year beginning on the first day of July 2022.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions to give effect to the financial proposals of the Gilgit-Baltistan Government for the year beginning on the first day of July-2022 for the purpose hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows: -

1. Short title, commencement, definitions and acronyms.

- (1) This Act shall be called the Gilgit-Baltistan Finance Act-2022.
- (2) It shall, unless specified otherwise, come into force on the first day of July 2022.
- (3) Government means Government of Gilgit Baltistan
- (4) ADP; Annual Development Plan
- (5) PSDP; Public Sector Development Plan
- (6) SNE; Statement of New Expenditure
- (7) PAO; Principal Accounting Officer
- (8) AA; Administrative Approval
- (9) MVRTMS; Motor Vehicles Registration and Taxation Management System
- (10) NDMA; National Disaster Management Authority.
- (11) GBDMA; Gilgit Baltistan Disaster Management Authority.
- (12) PPRA; Public Procurement Regulatory Authority.
- (13) GBA; Gilgit Baltistan Assembly.

- 3. Contract, Contingent and seasonal labor appointments. Contract appointments under ADP/PSDP projects fulfilling requirements of laws, rules and procedures shall remain admissible. However, there shall be ban on appointment of fresh contingent employees and extension of existing contingent employees, as the case may be, against Regular Budget, Development Budget and both Regular and Development Grants of LG&RD Department, except with the approval of Chief Minister Gilgit Baltistan, for a period not exceeding 89 days. This condition shall also apply on seasonal labor engaged by Works Department. Any appointment made in violation of these conditions shall be deemed as illegal. This ban shall not apply on Gilgit Baltistan Assembly Secretariat.
- 4. Repair/maintenance. Under regular grants, in order to carry out repair and maintenance works, Administrative Secretaries of Works and Water & Power Department shall not issue Administrative Approvals without securing prior funds or without seeking written permission from Finance Department, as the case may be. In case, Engineers execute work before AA is issued, the

liability shall be deemed as an illegal liability and they shall be penalized under E&D Rules and cost involved shall be recovered from their salary at source.

- 5. Emergency procurement of works and services (1) In Gilgit Baltistan Disaster Management Act, 2017, Section-24 (1) words "seek written approval of the Government to" shall be inserted after, "it may" and before, "procure". The District Disaster Management Authority with certificate envisaged under Section 24 (2) shall transmit the case for declaration of emergency. Once emergency is declared by the Government, concerned office shall submit the case with cost estimates, minutes of Disaster Management Authority meeting to Administrative Secretary for Admin Approval who shall issue AA immediately with time lines for completion of the work.
 - (2) Any procurement that falls under 42-D (iii) of PPRA Rules, 2004 shall be carried out only after the procuring agency brings up reasons, in writing, required under this Rule. Requests for Funds from Finance Department shall be entertained only after Secretary/PAO concerned under his seal and signature provides a certificate that conditions of 42-D (iii) have been met.
 - (3) In all procurements related to Section-4 and Section-5 (1) and (2), there shall be ban on ex-post facto approvals by Administrative Secretary. Any such approval, if granted, shall be deemed as illegal.
- 6 Advance drawl. There shall be ban on advance drawl permissions except;
 - i. In case of emergencies declared in writing by the Government.
 - ii. In unforeseen circumstances where causes could not be attributed to the procuring agency.
 - iii. In cases where Investment policies of the funds are approved by the government e.g Endowment Funds.
- 7. Asset inventories. The Water & Power Department and Works Department in consultation with Finance Department shall prepare and maintain inventories of all physical assets. The repair/maintenance expenditure on these assets shall be determined keeping in view their utility and previous expenditure incurred on them. These Departments shall also create stores for dealing with urgencies and contingencies.

8. Mitigation and relief works through Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners.

- b) Construction of minor protective bunds, compound walls around grave yards, public libraries, public parks, play grounds, public toilets.
- c) Provision/supply of water coolers to schools and vocational centers, sewing machines to needy women/widows, wheelchairs, walking aids, hearing and vision aids, artificial limbs, surgical appliances and communication aids for disable persons, not including government employees.
- d) Any other relief that authorities mentioned below find consistent with law and public service.

- (ix) Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners shall, quarterly, share with Finance Department details of relief and mitigation works carried out. In case of no compliance, subsequent release shall be withheld.
- 8. Vehicle inventories. The General Administration Department GB in consultation with Excise Department and Finance Department shall prepare an inventory of all government vehicles. The data shall be biannually updated on MVRTMS which shall be available online for Finance Department and Accountant General GB for budgeting and pre-audit purpose respectively.
- 9. Regulation of expenditure on official residences/offices .The General Administration Department in consultation with Works Department and Deputy Commissioners shall prepare inventories and expenditure trends of Government Residential Houses/Flats and Government offices to regulate expenditure on repair/maintenance.
- 10. Regulation of expenditure under ERE. Office of Accountant General, Gilgit Baltistan in consultation with Finance Department shall ensure that expenditure under ERE is made in line with updated SNEs. Any payment of pays and allowances made on higher scales, if those scales are not reflected in respective SNEs, shall be deemed as illegal. Government shall take measures to penalize those responsible for such payments.
- 11. Schedule of fee/charges. New or revised Non-Tax fee/charges, as the case may be, annexed at Schedule-I shall be implemented by respective Departments. Estimated non tax revenue of Rs. 3500 million shall be collected by the departments as per Schedule-II.
- 12. Consolidated Fund Sources. Besides existing fund sources, Funds collected from the sources given in Gilgit-Baltistan Forest Act, 2019 Chapter-3 Section-12 Sub Section-2(g) and (i) shall be credited into GB Consolidated Fund Account.
- 13. Local Government Fund sources. Collection of tolls, rates, fees and charges to be levied by the Local Councils of Gilgit- Baltistan under Schedule-III of Local Government Act, 2014 shall be reinforced.

- 14. Levy on hotels/guest houses and camping sites. With immediate effect, Excise & Taxation shall start collection of levies envisaged in GB Hotel Regulation and Levy Act, 2020.
- 15. Gilgit Baltistan Waste Management Company Fund Sources. The Service Delivery Charges approved by the Board of Directors GBWMC in its ^{2nd} meeting held on 20-10-2021 shall also be reinforced.
- 16. Contribution of residential allottees. Contribution at the rate of 5% of the initial basic pay shall be deducted at source into GB Consolidated Fund from the Government Employees who possess official accommodation. Works and GAD Departments shall get contributed fund utilization plan approved from the Government.
- 17. Admissibility of Allowances. There shall be ban on admissibility/introduction of new Allowances to the Government employees. Departments and Government entities shall not process such demands taking analogies from other Units of the country, unless Government initiates itself.
- 18. Appointments, promotions, regularizations and up gradations. The directions/orders from any authority/institution for appointments, regularizations and up gradations without following prescribed laws, rules, policies and procedures, shall accrue legitimacy after such directions/ orders are approved by the Government.
- 19. Internet facility to the entitled officers. The existing facility of residential telephone provided to entitled officers shall also extend to the internet facility within the existing ceiling of residential telephone.
- 20. Development projects involving land compensation. Departments shall preferably select those projects where land compensation is not involved.

21. Austerity Measures.

- (i) Following austerity measures shall be implemented by all Government functionaries;
 - a) There shall be complete ban on purchase all type of vehicles both from current and development expenditures excluding motorcycles, student busses, ambulances and firefighting vehicles except with the

- approval of Government and concurrence of Finance Division, Islamabad.
- b) There shall be complete ban on creation of new posts except for those required under development projects.
- c) Transfer of employees from one completed project to another project for the purpose of pay shall be banned except those recommended by the competent development forum and approved by the Government.
- d) Principal Accounting Officers (PAOs) shall ensure rationalized consumption of utilities i.e., electricity, gas, telephone etc.
- e) The expenditure on purchase of assets, repair & maintenance and all other operational expenditures shall be kept at bare minimum level while remaining within the budgetary allocation for the financial year.
- f) Two sides of paper shall be used in all official communications.
- g) All outstation meetings shall be conducted through internet link (Zoom etc.) only, unless physical presence is strongly justified and approved by the competent authority.
- h) There shall be complete ban on foreign tours except where it is inevitable to perform the tour in larger state/public interest.
- i) There shall be ban organizing events/seminars in expensive hotels/venues.
- be discouraged and strict checks shall be introduced at each controlling level. Use of official vehicles by Cabinet Members, heads of administrative Departments/Special institutions and other government officers shall be restricted to only one vehicle.
- k) There shall be ban on serving official lunches, dinners and refreshments from public exchequer.
- l) 40% cut on POL expenditure shall be ensured.
- m) Unnecessary and frequent inter-district posting transfers shall be discouraged to avoid expenditures on transfer TA grants.

- n) There shall be ban on attachment of employees in Gilgit Baltistan Secretariat except with prior concurrence of Finance Department.
- (ii) In the above context, to cater for the indispensable needs of Departments/Organizations, etc. an Austerity Committee is constituted comprising the following officers to review the critical/unavoidable/significant proposals only:

a. Additional Secretary Finance (Chair)

b. Deputy Secretary (Expenditure) (Member)

c. Deputy Secretary (Budget) (Member)

d. Deputy Secretary (Development) (Member)

e. Deputy Secretary of the respective Department (Member)

f. Deputy Secretary (GAD) (Member)

g. Deputy Secretary Law Department. (Member)

- 22. Removal of difficulty. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, Government may make such order, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as it may consider necessary for removal of such difficulty.
- 23. Power to make rules & regulations. The Gilgit Baltistan Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules & regulations for carrying out the purposes of this Act, if deemed necessary.
- **24.** Overriding effect. This Act shall override all other laws wherever applicable.
- 25. Repeal effect. Finance Act, 2021 shall stand repealed except for the Sections referred to be continued and to the extent of orders issued under this Act.
