Introduction

Muhammad (peace and blessing be upon him) was born in Makkah in the year of 570, at a time when Christianity was not yet fully established in Europe. As he grew up, he became known for his truthfulness, generosity and sincerity, so that he was sought after his ability to arbitrate in disputes. The historians describe him as calm and meditative. Muhammad was of a deeply religious nature, and it became his habit to meditate from time to time in the Cave of Hira near the summit of Jabal-ul-Nur, the 'Mountain of Light' near Makkah. At the age of 40, while engaged in a meditative retreat, Muhammad (peace be upon him) received his first revelation from God the Angel Gabriel. This revelation which continued for twenty-three years, is known as Quran.

I only deny what you brought and what you call people to'. The Quranic verses bears testimony to the fact that the mercy for all the creatures is in the shape of Holy Prophet (P.B.U.H) which is enlightened throughout with truth. His truthfulness personality as a messenger touched every living person at Makkah and they were forced to think about the message of God.

Holy Prophet (P.B.U.H) said:

Truthfulness leads to righteousness. And righteousness leads to paradise.

3- Selflessness and Sincerity

Muhammad (P.B.U.H) worked all his life with utmost sincerity for the well-being of his fellow men. He (S.A.W) spent all his time, his resources, and his energies on guiding the ignorant people of Arabia to the light of Islam. He wanted to save them from a life of evil and misery and bring them to the ways of goodness and piety. Sometimes he felt sick and hurt at their bitter remarks and strong opposition

but never lost hope or gave away. God often tried to comfort him on such occasions:

Quran says:

"Follow not the wishes of the disbelievers and the hypocrites, and ignore their persecution and put your trust in God."

At the age of 40, He (P.B.U.H) became Prophet after nomination as Allah's Prophet, He (P.B.U.H) became more polite, merciful and God fearing.

"Once, a nomad came to the Prophet (P.B.U.H) and said, "You kiss your children but we do not - The Prophet (P.B.U.H) said "What should I do with you if Allah stripped mercy from your heart!?"

6- A Responsible and Best Husband
Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) set an example for his wives with his behaviour and actions. Therefore, the head of the family should behave in the manner he expects his spouse to behave. Prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H) conversed with his wives that he cared about even their relatively small problems. He (P.B.U.H) ^{also} considered it important to please them spiritually. He told his wives their virtue, told them that he loved them, took them on his mount, and helped his wife get on the animal by stepping on his knee.

7- A Perfect Exemplar

The Prophet was and is still the perfect example to follow.

The Quran states:

"In-deed in the Messenger of Allah (Muhammad SAW) you have a good example to follow for him who hopes in (the Meeting with) Allah and the

The Prophet (PBUH) was sent as a role model for generations to be adopted. He (PBUH) was the finest embodiment of modesty, and deeply abhorred arrogance and haughtiness. Almost all his companions in the early days were poor and oppressed people, as he was the champion of the downtrodden and the defender of the deprived masses. His (PBUH) house was simple and modest, built of clay bricks, palm leaves and banks. His (PBUH) food was simple like that of the poor, consisting mostly of barley bread. He (PBUH) socialised with his companions as one of them: talking, smiling, listening and displaying a sense of humor. Owing to his great modesty, he normally preferred riding
