Realizing the importance education, he established mational institutes which include two Madrassalus in Muradaload (1858 and Ghazidoad (1862), sejentific Societa (1864), M.A.O High School Higarh (1875), and M. A. O college and university (1920). Firthermore, he established Muhammadan Educational Conference in 1886 in order to bringe political awarevers smong the Musling.
