Poverty is not the sole leading factor of crime.
(thesis)

- a) low risks and high rewards burgeoning multifarious criminal activities in any state.
- b) discriminatory criminal justice system allows crime and criminal activities to flourish
- c) greed and lust for more as a prime factor behind corporate and white collar crimes
- d) fulfillment of ideological goals as a driving reason for state criminals (eg terror groups like TTP, ISIS, Al-Qaeda)
- e) psychosocial and genetic factors as leading cause of crime for domestic abusers and drug offenders

4. Bleak financial situation is an enabler of criminal activities (antithesis)
- poor people make the most of weak crime prevention institutions that manifests as street crimes, theft, robbery etc
 - poor criminals swear allegiance to powerful elite for legal impunity
 - people from lower tiers of society also indulge in crime for financial gains
 - terrorist organizations hire people from humble backgrounds to form their "terror armies"
 - poor living conditions favour the expression of psychogenetic factors in the form of criminal activities
5. Variegated and multifarious causes lead to criminal activities (synthesis)
- corrupt political bureaucracy and military top brass are the beneficiaries of the weak crime prevention system of any state
 - a plethora of the 'poor accused' are the affectees of weak criminal justice system as in Pakistan.

- c) financial gain for 'poor' is a means of sustenance while monetary advantage for corporate criminals is a means of hoarding capital
- d) highly sophisticated terror organizations have professionals, religious or political elites at their helm.
- e) domestic abuse and drug offense is also rampant in considerably cultured parts of our society
