2. Definition of planning institution



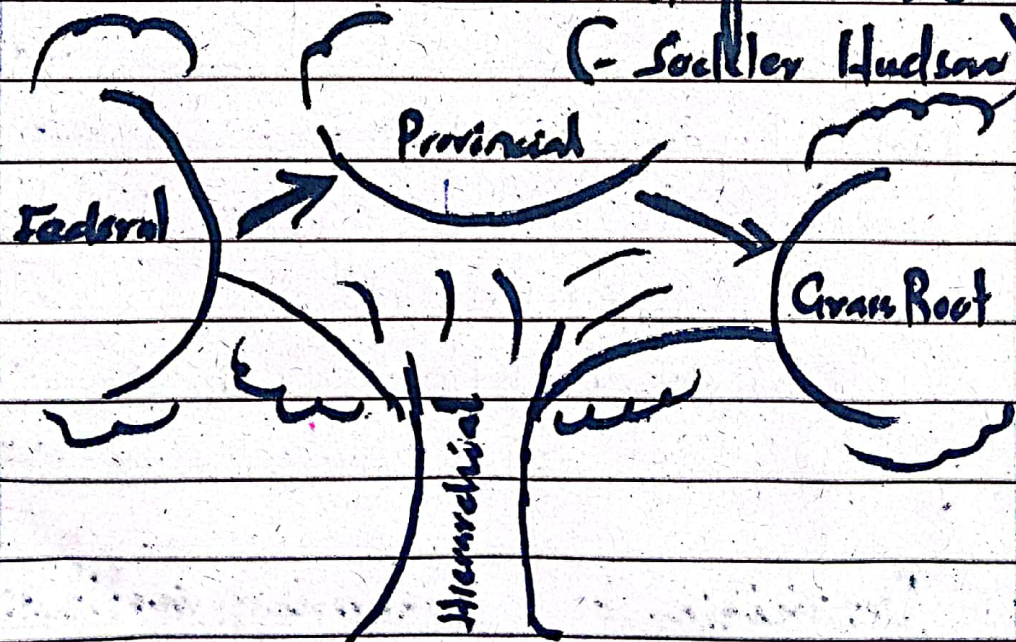
"Planning institutions are a rational process with organized structure to achieve public demands."

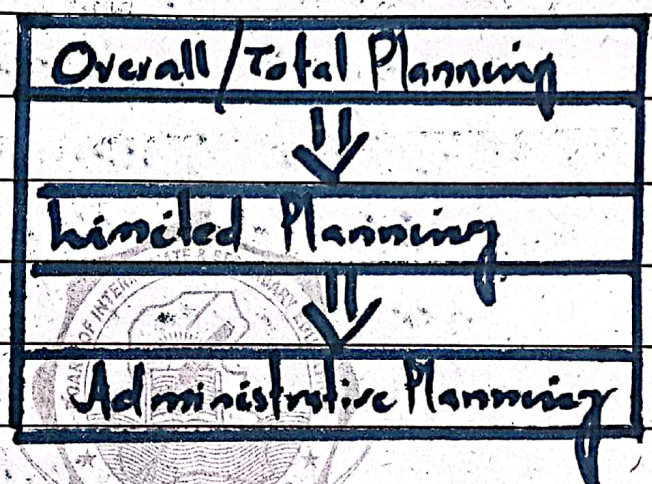
Planning Institution Hierarchy

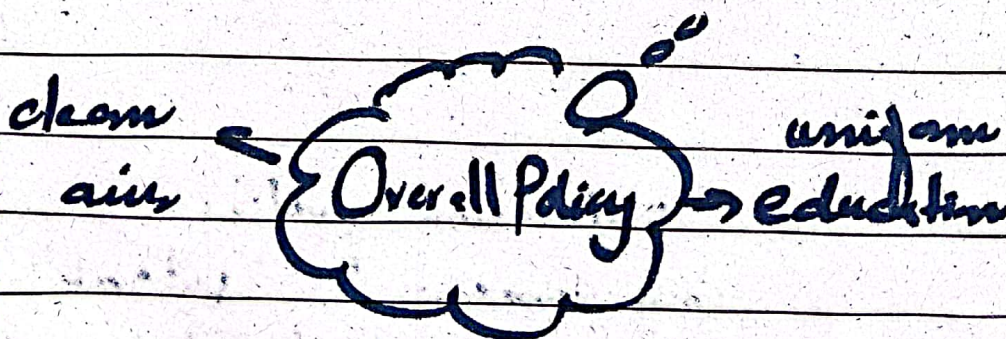
Therefore, total policy includes

organized with full perspective.

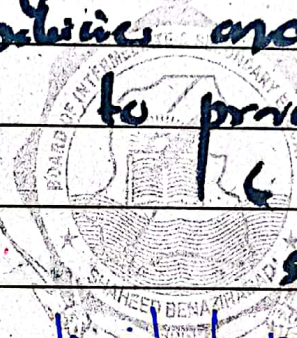




### b) Limited Planning

4- John De Millet process of Planning

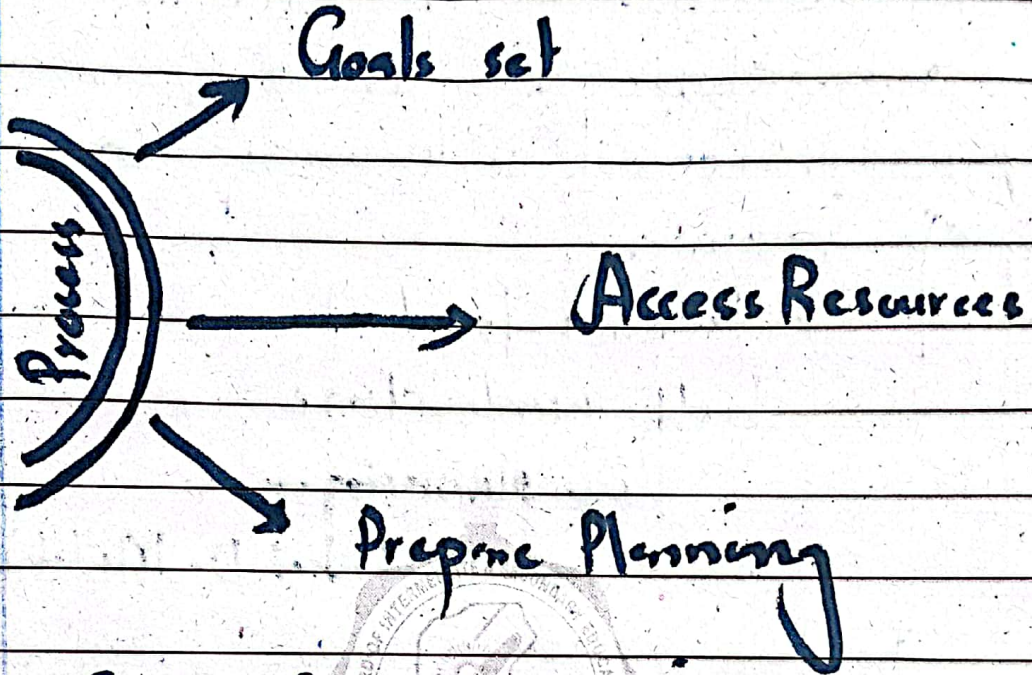
"Planning is a complete set of assigned and designed tasks."
