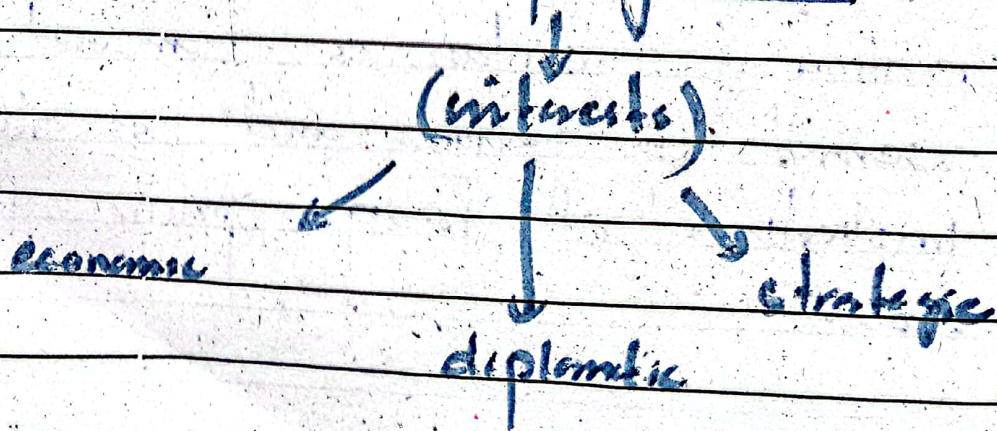

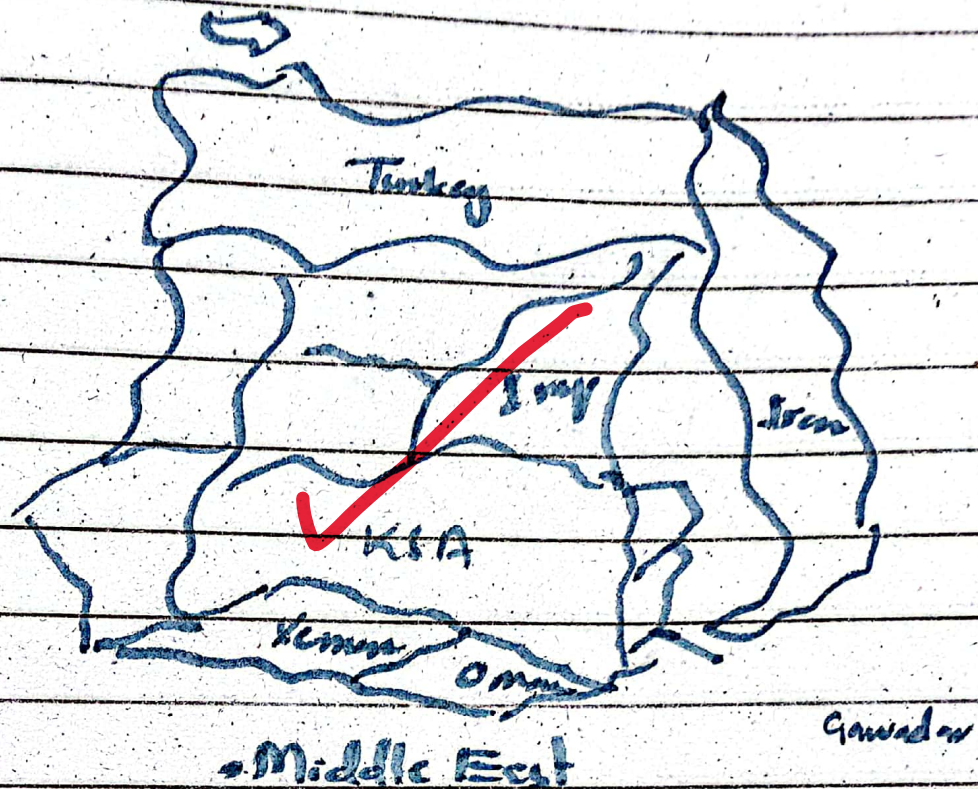
Moreover, Pakistan has also strengthened relations with Saudi Arab.

provide a channel to South Asian countries and

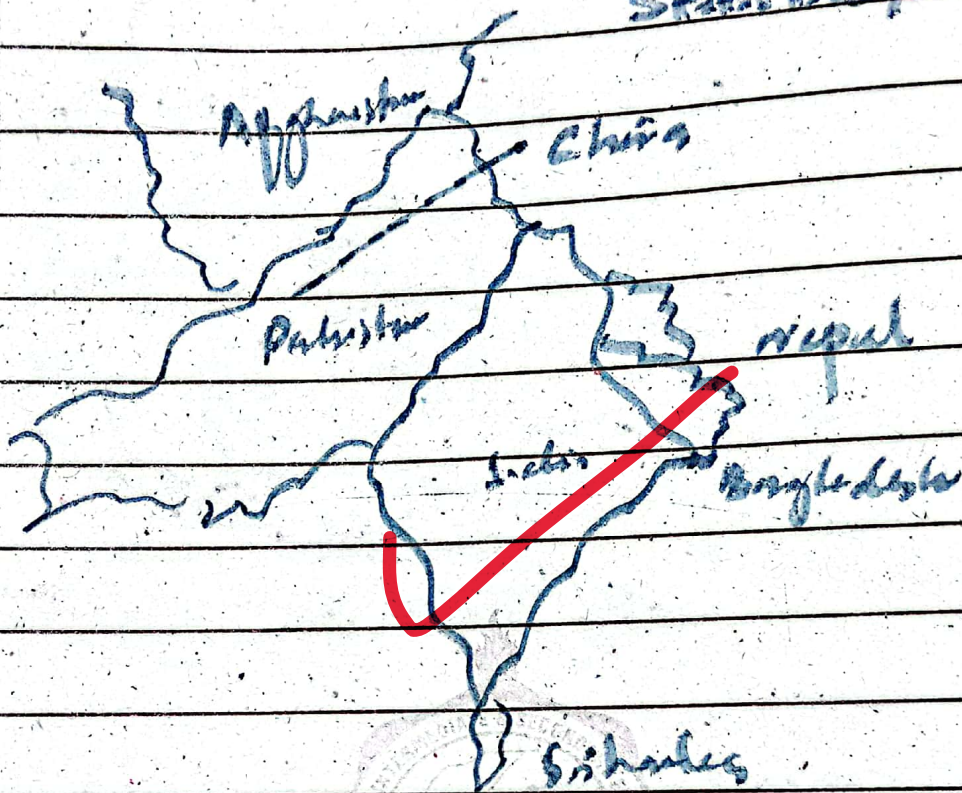
Pakistan will be

### d) Relations with East Asia

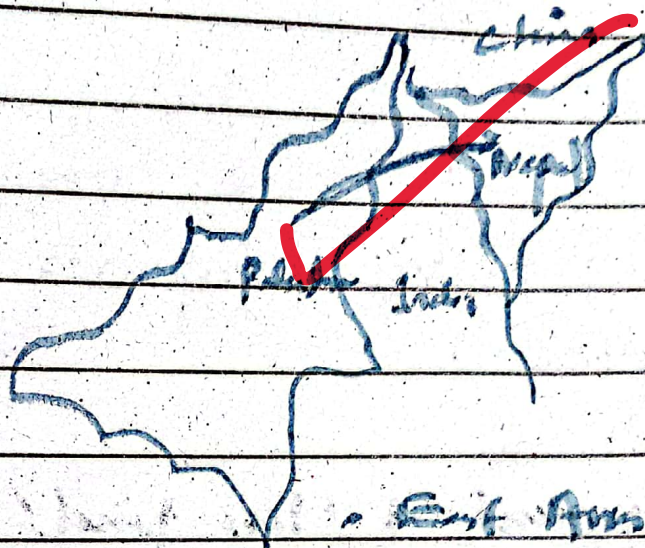
Further, Pakistan also focus relations with East Asia. In fact, Pakistan fulfills its needs from sources of East Asia.
