But Muslims were very disappointed due to this change therefore; they were anemic towards western English Education. They were hostile to the new system of education due to four reasons. 1- They considered this new English education inferior to the traditional Islamic learning.
2- They considered that this education was being forced on them. 3- They were of the opinion that this education has no need and use for them.

4- They were thinking that modern education will divert them from their true religion and that it is against the verses of Quran. The result was that they remain backward in education. During the period of 1859-1875, only twenty Muslims got BALBISC degrees. While on the other hand, Hindus who welcomed this education system were seven hundred and fifteen in number who did their in number who did their graduation. At this critical stage,

Sir spyed Ahmed Khan came forward and guided the muslims in the right direction.

He believed that Muslims Can not go for progress without right direction and modern education.

He removed all the pulsimant fillusion from the muslims mind. For him the real value of modern education lay in the fact that it was design to improve character and social morals

and make its recipients better citizens. Equipped with education, Muslims would thus be able to discharge their social obligations and work for the progress and welfare of their country. The Aligarh Movement focused on moderne ang Muslim education by introducing western scrence, literature, and rationally Ento the curriculum. The Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) was founded as a result, with an emphasis on imparting western-style education while incorporating Islamic education. This educational approach aimed to equip muslims with the knowledge and skills required to compete in various professional fields.

Too lengthy description Political awareness: Si'v Spyed Ahmad khan effort in Politics was to keep the Mustims away from joining the Congress. He Strongly advised the Muslims against joining the Hindu

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dominated congress. He was in favor of reserved seats for Muslims and also promoted the idea that Hindus and Muslims are two distinct nations. This idea led to the two-Nation theory. Prefer education over politics:

The movement's emphasis on radionality and knowledge fostered critical thinking, leading Muslims to analyze there socre-political situation. This, in turn, contributed to the development of a political consciousness among the community.
