Causes of Honour Killing

Honour Killing is caused
by multiple factors which
are deeply rooted in a
society. These may be -

1- Patriarchy - Around the
world superior position of
man still exists.

2. Violation of Social Norms.

When a woman goes against her social and cultural norms, her life is threatened by her own family.

As Gendel Baloch was killed by her own brother on her violation of cultural norms.

3. Tribal Laws.

In tribes, honour killings is mostly considered

legal.
In 2017, a tribal council
in Khyber Agency ordered
the honour killing of a 13 year
old girl. She was accused
of 'running away' with a boy.

Solution: Addressing Honour Killing

Through education: Provision of
education to both men and
women is required. Men must
learn about women rights
and to implement them in
his life. While woman
should also know her
rights and legal provisions
of her protection.

Understanding religious teachings.
There must be

a rightful interpretations of religious injunctions to counter honour killing.

Implementation of laws:

There is no dearth of legal provisions protecting women from honour killing. However, their effective implementation is absent in a society.
