Following are powers and functions:

a) Legislative powers of King  
Following are legislative powers:

i) Appointment of premier  
King appoints premier of the government.

"All officials are appointed on the ~~consultation~~ <sup>consultation</sup> of king."

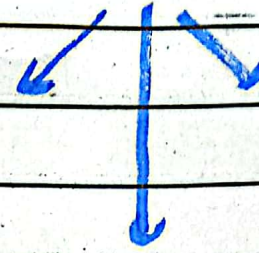
This shows executive power of king regarding appointment.

Moreover, king can also pardon prisoners.



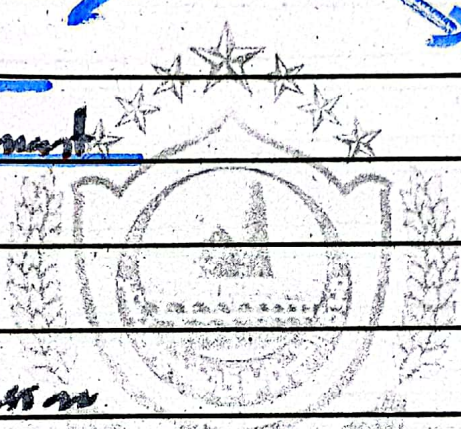
"King can pardon prisoners and judges can not go against him."
