The brightest minds leaving the countries, means few experienced teachers, researchers and mentors for institutions of higher education. This diminishes the quality of education and research opportunities available to students within Pakistan. This fact is beautifully summed up by Malala Yousafzai, a advocate of girls education in Pakistan, as

When a nation loses its youth, it loses

The driving force behind progress and innovation. (Malala Yousafzai)

Thus absence of educated people creates gaps in education system of Pakistan.

Along with creating gaps in education system it also hinders the development of country. The departure of highly skilled professionals left behind a shortage of expertise in various sectors. This leads to reduced productivity, slower economic growth and hampers the development of various sectors and industries. According to the World Bank Report

on Brain Drain

"Brain drain leads to the loss of highly skilled individuals, resulting in a decline in overall human capital and potential economic growth".

This shows that brain drain of professionals hampers the development of country in economic terms.

Similarly, economic problems also lead towards social implications. This increases the social disruption and gender gaps among

Youth As professionals, sensible and responsible citizens moved out, irresponsible, illiterate & ill mannered left to deteriorate the situation further. This leads to crime, low maintenance of law and order and gender disparity. The higher rates of crimes, terrorism and Smuggling is also testimony of this fact.

Aside social implications this also reduces the access to skilled professionals. Innovative entrepreneurs and professional who find limited resources and support in Pakistan choose to leave Pakistan to secure their future. This deprive the nation of professionals to save them in time of need. The deterioration

health care system in Pakistan could be seen as its implications on Health Sector.

The Pakistan Demographic and Health Survey reports that there is a shortage of doctors in Pakistan, with only 1.1 doctors per 1,000 people compared to the World Health Organization's recommendation of 3 doctors per 1,000 people.

According to The International Organization for Migration (IOM), Pakistan experienced a net loss of over 1.5 Million highly skilled professionals between 2000 and 2014, leading to a noticeable gap in various sectors such as healthcare and technology.

Hence this shows how brain drain contributes to reduction in skilled professionals at home.

Another effect that brain drain inflicts on country is the loss of revenue. Governments rely on income taxes to fund their social programs and infrastructure projects. A mass exodus leads to a drop in tax receipts which stunt economic growth and development.

The ceaseless loss of intellectual capital is a
immeasurable loss for Pakistan but it brings

some positive changes. Among the various advantages
which overseas bring to their country, the important
one is its transfers knowledge and skill enhance-

Brain drain can act as a form of reverse
brain circulation, as migrants return home
with new ideas, skills and connections.

Upon returning they can deliver their skills
in various departments to bring development
in the country. The most famous example of
this could be given by naming Doctor

Abdul Qadeer (QA) Khan who is responsible

for Pakistan acquiring the technology to build
an atomic bomb. He choosed to serve the

nation in this way. Hence Overseas professionals
abroad could bring change in their country

Along with transferring skills, overseas
diaspora contributes to send remittances
to their origin country. These funds helps

to stabilize the foreign exchange reserves,
improve balance of trade and alleviate

poverty in some areas. According to Pew Research Pakistan diaspora abroad send \$17.3bn which stands it fifth in the world. Hence brain drain is also contributing to balance the economy.

Further more, active diaspora outside can help to bring positive image of its country. It can promote its culture and values through success stories. By promoting culture and value, they can spread ~~is~~ positivity about nation. Mr. Nadella is a major player in bringing cricket to America through league matches which could provide more employment opportunities for South Asian cricketers besides sending remittances to keep the country strong. So, by spreading positivity, they can also serve to bring positive image on outsider's minds.

Along with spreading positivity around the world they also invest in their country to bring development in various sectors. This would increase the faith of professionals in their country to serve for it. They

could also bring new technology, skills to their country to advance it in economic terms. A study by Oxford University found that Pakistani professionals who migrated abroad often acquire new skills and knowledge which can transfer back to their home country, contributing to its development. For example Dr. Aamina Khan, a Pakistani neuroscientist who pursued her education abroad, returned to Pakistan and established a state-of-the-art research center to share her acquired knowledge and mentor young scientists. Hence abroad experience helped them to serve in their country.

Brain drain may contribute to bring change in society. However, it has some implications for Pakistan. Pakistan cannot afford outflow of its youth in such larger numbers. Pakistan invests significantly in the education and training of individuals only to lose them to other countries.

As far concerns of youth, they do not want to come back if they ever get chance to go abroad. A Gallup Survey results
