Introduction:

powers including the Palestine. Furthermore, the Balfour Declaration of 1917 paved the way for the formation of an illegal Jewish state in the Palestine. In 1922, the League of Nations mandated the Palestine to British for the next 25 years. Thus, Palestine came under the control of British which speeded up the Jewish immigration and settlement in the disputed region. In result, this led to the bilateral skirmishes. In these circumstances, the British coined the Peel Commission Accord in 1937, which reduced the Jews immigration and settlement. Further more, followed by the UN resolution, Oslo Accord and the Camp David Peace Treaty, but no one war was materialized. In addition to these treaties, multiple wars were fought between the Israel and Arabs. However, this dispute is the long persisted unresolved dispute in the Middle-East. The Palestine-Israel dispute is the illegal settlement and occupation of Jews in the Palestine that led to the displacement of hundreds of thousands of Palestinians and occupation of their territories by the Jewish settlers. The only

Solution to the dispute is - the two independent states along each other.
