### FIRST WAVE OF FEMINISM (1848-1920)

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Women in the era of first feminism did not have any major rights. Most importantly, women Suffrage was the right that women were fighting for.

200 women met at New York Upstate to discuss about the convention. 12 resolutions were passed regarding women's rights. The major one in this convention was the women's suffrage.

Seneca Fall Convention played a major role in first wave of feminism.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton drafted the convention based on U.S. Independence Declaration.

## IV. FIRST WAVE AND ABOLOITIONISM

First wave feminism was also in favor of abolition of Slavery. Fredrick Douglass, a famous abolitionist, supported and worked for first wave feminism.


(i) Women of Color and their Contributions

Margaret Sanger opened 1st birth control clinic in 1916.

## VII. SUCCESS OF FIRST WAVE

19<sup>th</sup> amendment in US granted rights to everyone to cast vote.

(ii) Australia - Commonwealth Franchise Act

In Australia, through Commonwealth Franchise Act, people got right of suffrage.

(iii) Finland, Switzerland and Great Britain - Suffrage rights

Other countries such as Finland, Australia and Switzerland also gave the right to vote to men and women equally.
