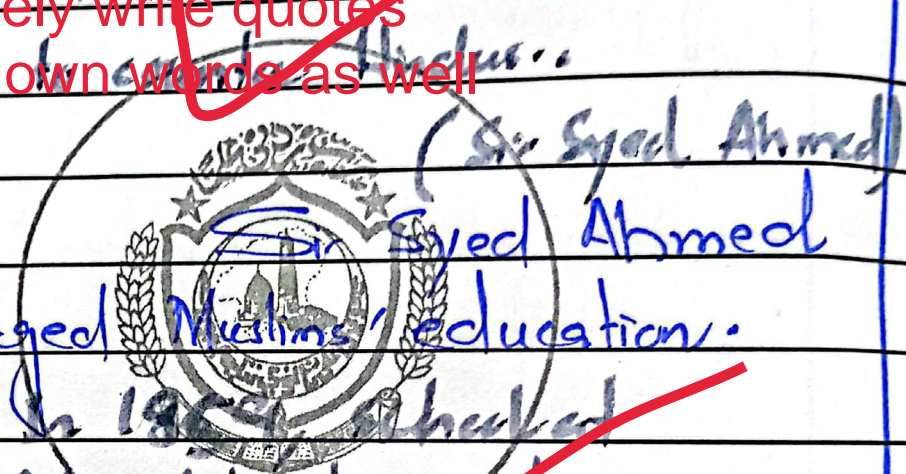
Aligarh movement had a basic purpose of modern education. In fact, need of modern education was realized at the great extent. Thus, Aligarh movement

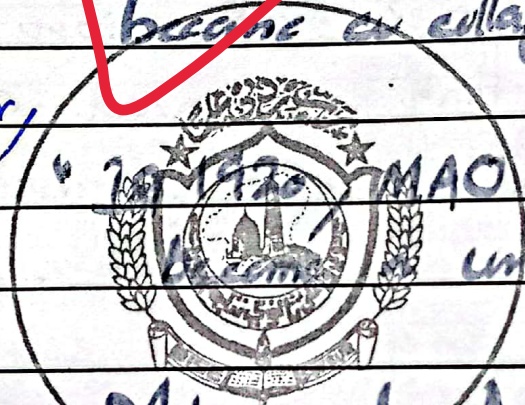

Moreover Mohammedan Anglo Oriental College was founded in 1874.

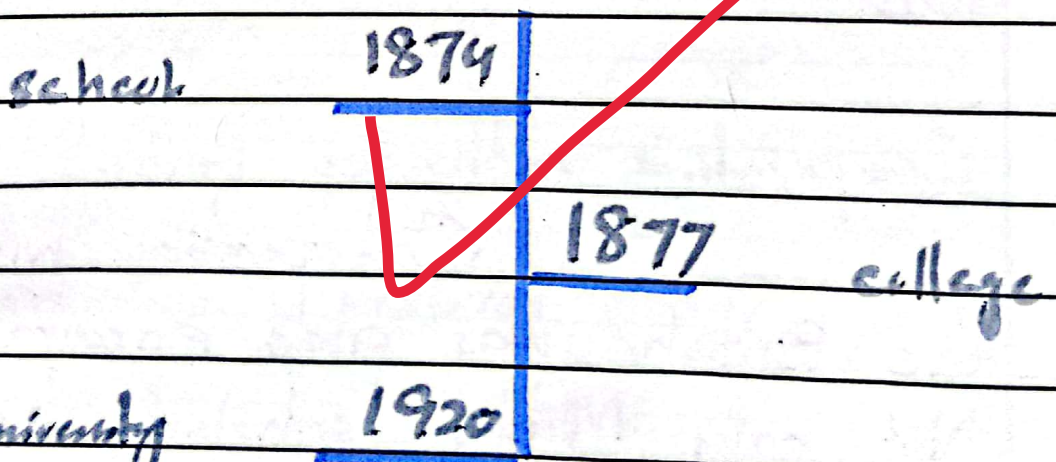

a) Modern education

The main motive was modern education. Muslims were getting advanced education.

Along with religious education system, and western education became compulsory.

b) Cooperation with the British

ng.

'Tehzeeb-Ikhlague' main objective to build character of Muslims.

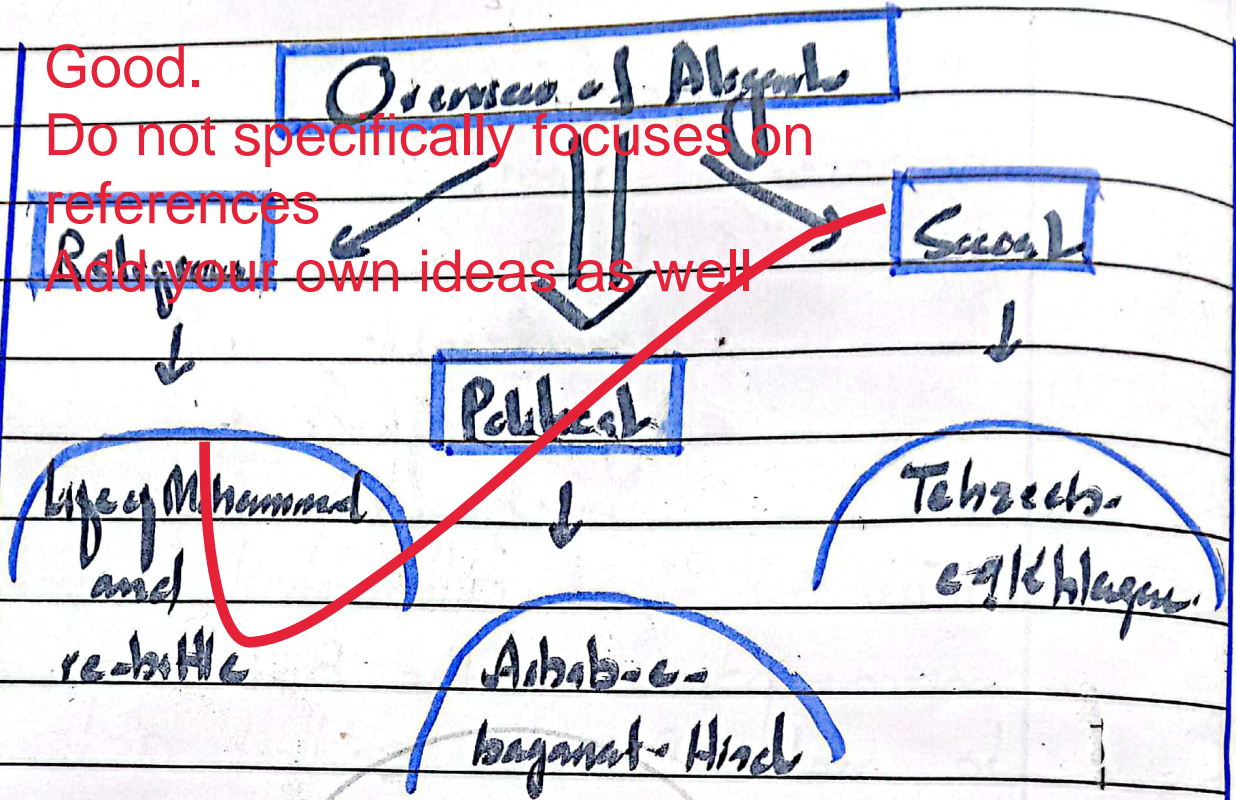
