IR's evolution as an independent field of study and its importance:

International Relations has been

Inspite of contradictions in its emerging point, it has vast and evident scope.

IR as a deals with political, non-political affairs b/w and among states, international organizations, international political economy and security, conflict or war and peace studies, Military strategies, globalization, interdependence, theories, approaches of IR and much more.

(ii) nation - state system:

(iv) post - world war (I):

Some scholar believes that IR has no academic grounds onset of world war(I). They believe it has been emerged as a subject when organizations like League of Nations emerged and the debates of colonialism ended with the begining of communism and imperialism.


Actual starting point of IR:

With the passage of time its scope increased with the addition of great events in historic time. Thus, International Relations as an academic discipline is transitional in nature.

Post-war factor playing major role in changing nature of IR:

Many post-war factors played major role in changing and advancing nature as well as scope of IR. That includes

- * Dawn of nuclear age with the shift from Balance of Power to the Balance of Terror.
- * Formation of International organizations i.e UN, OIC, EU etc.
- * Beginning of era of economic interdependence with the formation of IMF World Bank through Bretton Woods System.
- * Start of the advent of an information age with becoming world as global village and media as fourth pillar of state.
