→ Overview of Local Self-Government:

Local

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Self government is grass root level democratic government that resolves issues at lower level. Most of the democratic states in the world has local self government functioning at lower levels. In Pakistan, Article 140 of the constitution ensures local self government.

Local self government has three tiers.
