"Whether you agree with me or not
I am not going to change my
decision."

The lady told her husband that
whether he agreed with her or
not she was not going to change
her decision. (Indirect sp.)

(9) The landlord ~~has~~ said to the young
man, "If you do not pay your
rent by evening today you will
have to leave the house immediately."

The landlord has told the young man
that if he does not pay his rent by
evening that day he will have to
leave the house. (Indirect)
