#### 1- Introduction

5- Rule of law compromised when political instability prevails

a. Political instability in Karachi and its domino effect on the cities' prevalent law and order situation

b. Persistent political ups and downs leading to police departments' inefficiency and shifted focus

c. Lack of strong institutions resulting in them underperforming - the pertinent example of

Waziristan, post military operations

d. Political turmoil in Afghanistan - a resultant rogue state.

e. Global examples of prevalence of order declining in states amidst their political crisis - the Arab Spring.

6 - Balancing through this interlinked situation

a. Strength of stability: upholding the rule of law

b. Practicing democratic rights should not equate to street politics - floor of the parliament must be used to voice concerns.

c. Political parties must put their foot down when mobilization starts shaping up as anarchy.

d. Institutional strength should be ensured by practicing politics - administration dichotomy

e. Legislative reforms must be made to limit political activities beyond the point they hinder law and order.
