organization, more than 43% of
global agriculture labour force is

in agriculture sector. According to
United Nations, if women had
equal agricultural resources
as men had, this could

increase agriculture production to
(4.1%) four percent. So, women
are needed to be empowered in
developing states to mitigate
hunger crisis.

role to control population growth rate in developing states, but this is possible only through women's empowerment. When women are economically strong, they are able to plan their family. Otherwise, they have to bear their needs knee in the front of their men who consider women as created to produce and brought up children. For example, women in west are empowered. They have full control on their body. They are allowed to decide when and how much children they want. Contrarily, women in Pakistan are dependent on their husbands. For example, a man in Quetta, Jan Muhammad, is father of sixty children. This shows result of illiteracy of women, and their dependency on men lead to high population growth rate. For example, two sisters in Kozhikode were thrown acid for refusing marriage proposal in december, 2022 according to law, minimum age for marriage is 18 years, but still child marriages take place. This is due to poor governance and feeble implementation of these laws. So, good governance should be ensured to empower women in developing States.

They worked as a reserved army in industries during world war I and world war II. They played vital role in civil rights war. This shows that they are no inferior to men. Women
