The fear of mysteries of life led humans to connect with gods. The wishes of the gods in the form of oracles, were delivered to human beings through soothsayers. The ancient Greek oracles were based on these norms of foreseeing. These oracles were properly located in the divine places and related to one or other of the gods: Appollo communicated the decisions proclaimed by Zeus to the dead; Delphi conveyed signals through Appollo and Dodona worked with Zeus.
