(Transgender Rights, 2023)

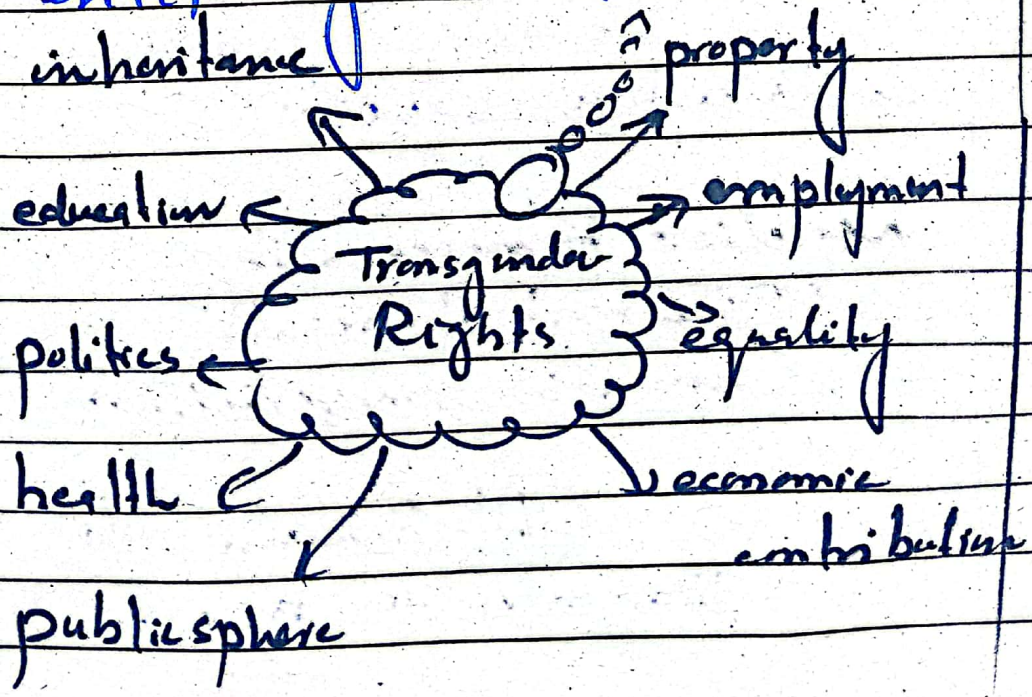
Therefore, safety is guaranteed according to the act.
