multiple meanings.

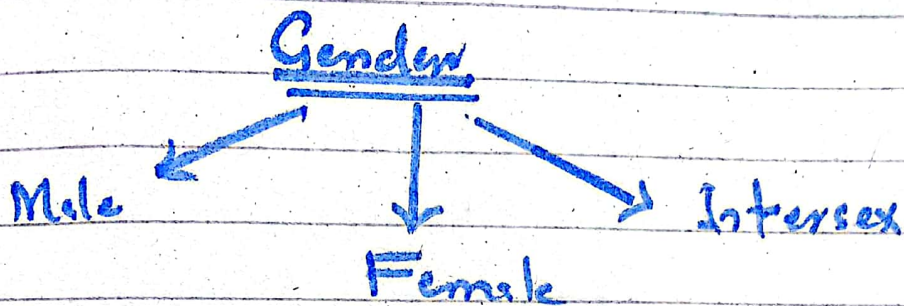

Gender is a biological born.

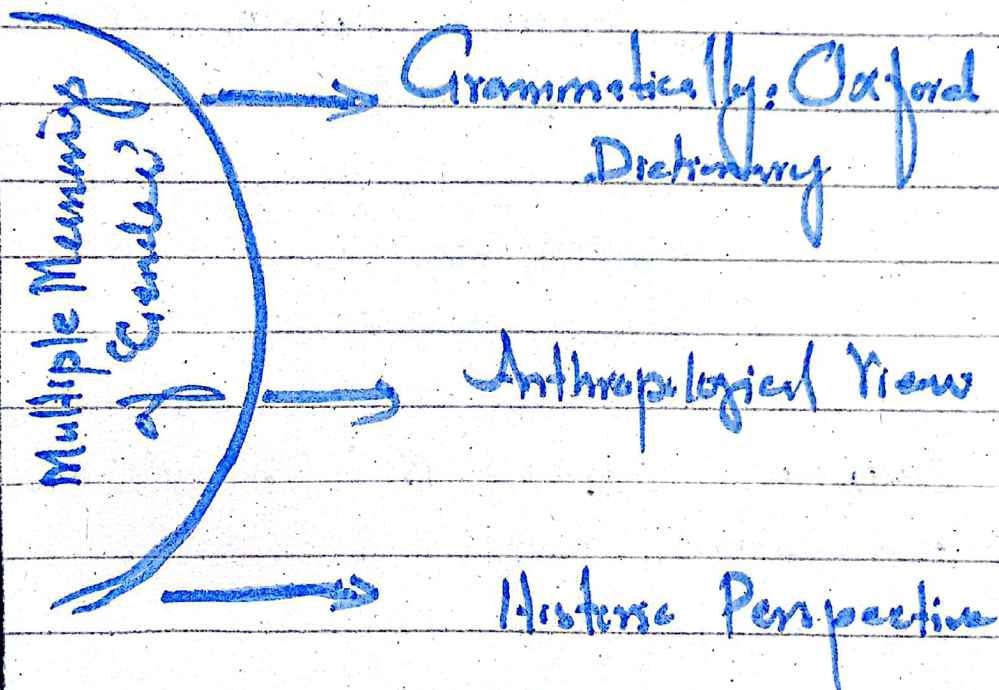
In fact, it adopts all characteristics
