



- 1980's → 20,000 Gays infected of AIDS
- Teressa de Lauretis → named Queer or in her writings
- Queer theory gave name to lesbians & Gays academically at first.
- Teressa de Lauretis was encouraged by Judith Butler & Michael Foucault
- Key Assumptions
 - (Any role can be performed by any gender)
 - ① Gender identity is fluid → (it varies from society to society, culture to culture, individual to individual)
 - ② Criticized repressive hypothesis → A matter of public consent
 - ③ Challenge the traditional role of gender.
 - ④ Be rebellion / not conformist.
 - ⑤ Counter / Discourage Phallocentrism.

Gender Performativity Theory → Theory given by "Judith Butler" in his book "Gender Trouble".
