Further, Iran also denied to attend G-20 Summit held in Kashmir.

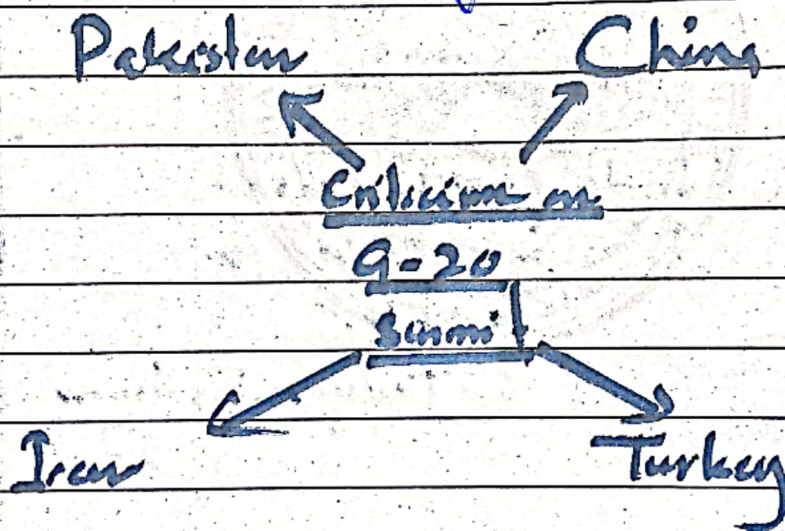
According to Iranian president,
