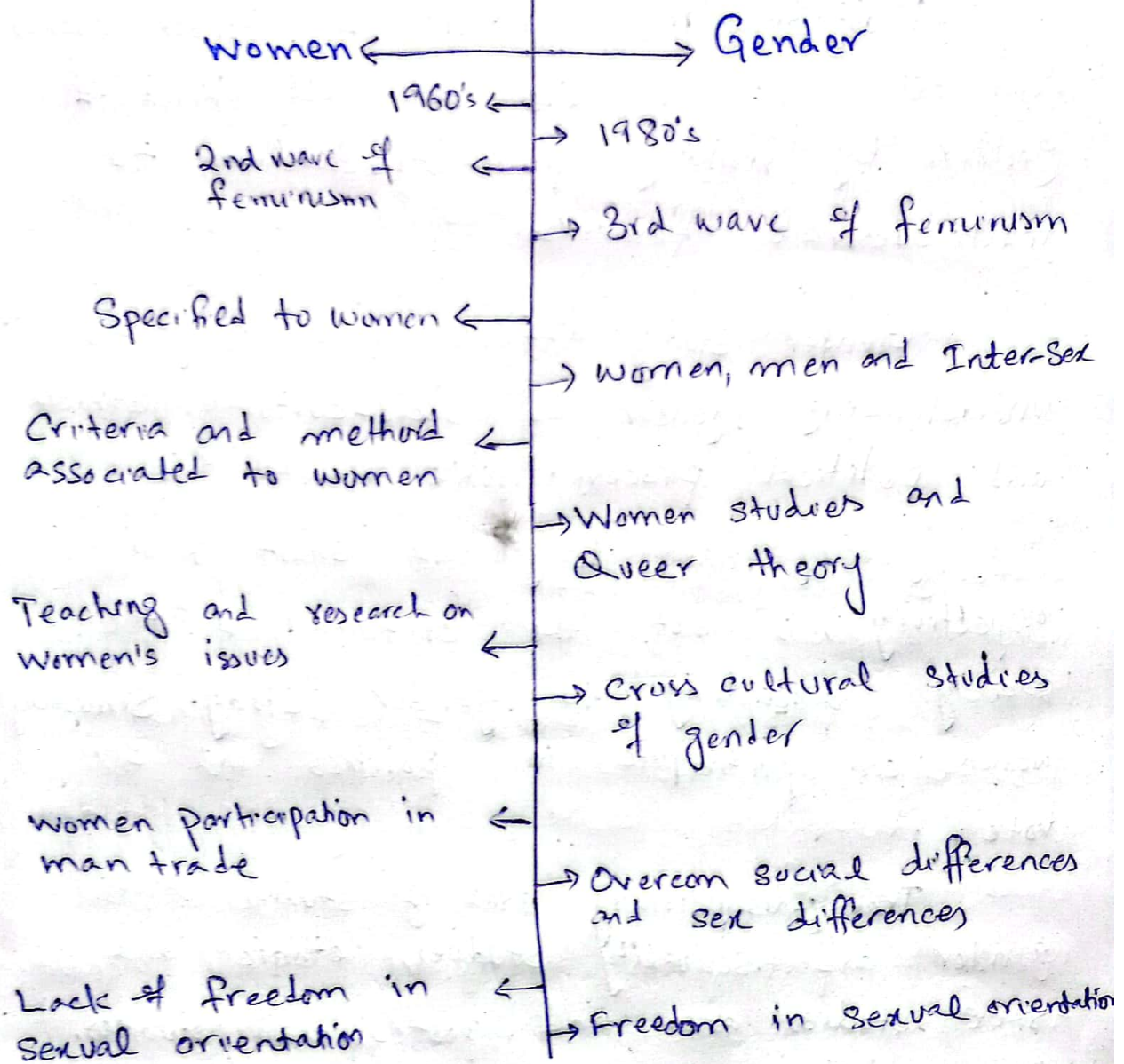
third wave of feminism: Rights related to women, color, culture, religion, and LGBT rights. These are the basis reason to introduce another subject called Gender Studies.

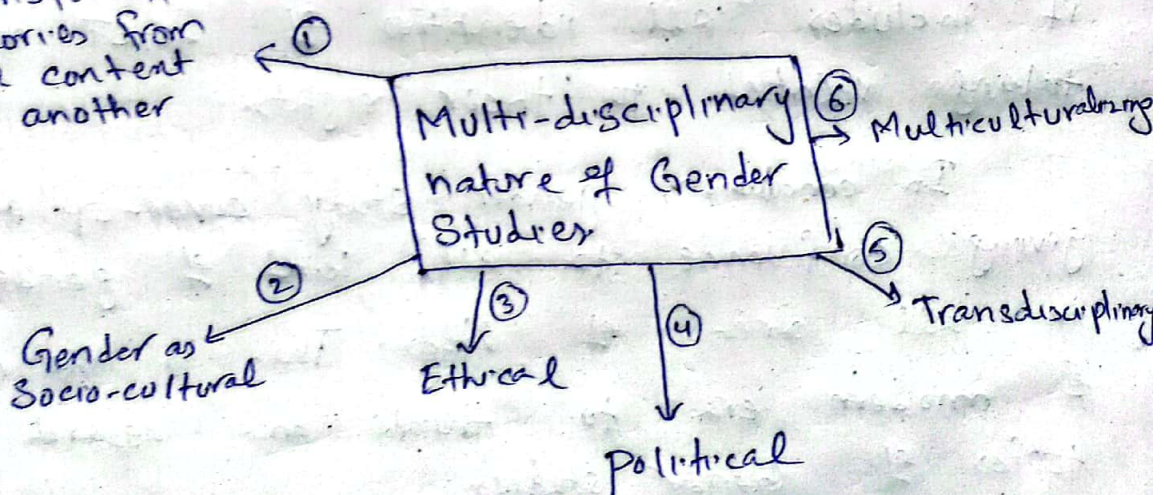
Women studies had only limited scope for female like Lack of freedom in sexual orientation. However in Gender studies women have freedom in sexual orientation.

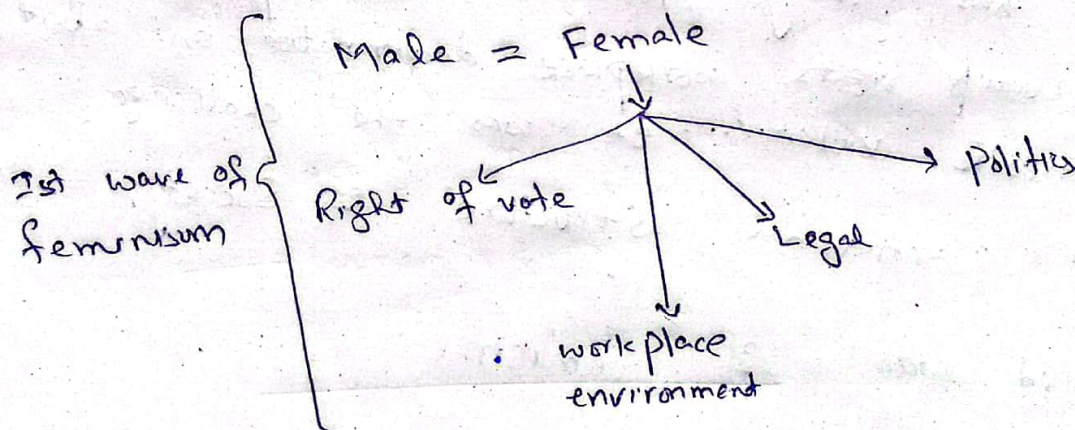
Shed light on first wave and third wave of feminism?

Introduction:

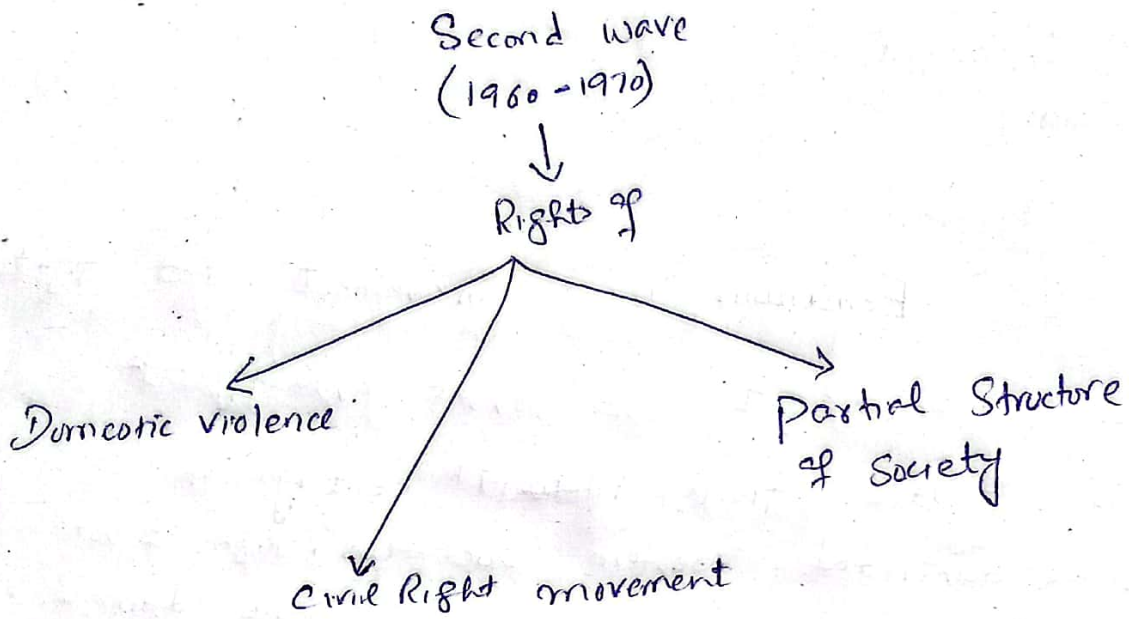

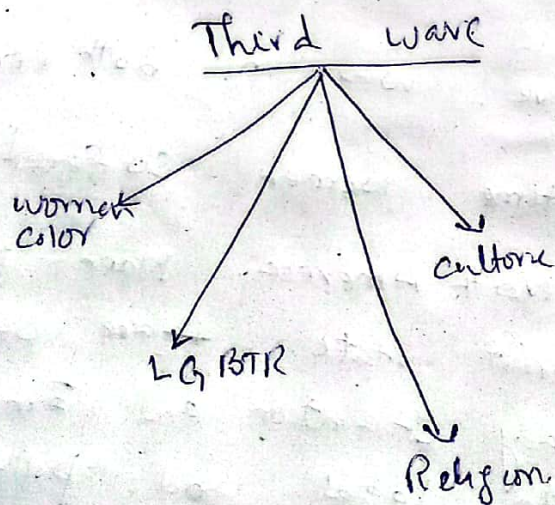
Second wave of feminism:
