Islamic ummah is divided and violating
the verse of Quran.

(3) Internal Challenges :-

The following internal challenges faced by muslim

* intellectual crisis and stagnation.

* modernization and ummah.

* political disunity

* Rich in resources but poor in management

* fundamentalism and rise of extremism

* middle eastern crises

* prevalence of unbridled materialism

* moral decline

* lacking education

* failure to portray spiritual message of islam

I: Intellectual Crisis and stagnation :-

The Muslim world was once at the forefront

Historical Factors :-

scientific and intellectual innovation with scholars such as Ibn Rushd (Averroes)

* Ibn Sina (Avicenna)

* Al-Khwarizmi making significant contributions to fields like medicine, mathematics and philosophy.

However, after the falls of the Abbasid Caliphate and the rise of colonialism, neo-colonialism, poor governance, economic underdevelopment, authoritarianism some of which can be attributed to the real or imagined influence of increasing devotional religiosity of the masses.

Example :-

* Afghanistan :-

Sunni Taliban turn secular schools into Islamic madrassa, valuing religious studies over modern science.

* Saudi Ulema :-

until the 1960's Saudi Sunni Ulema opposed any attempts at modernisation considering it as innovation (bidah).

2: Modernization and Ummah :-

* The world is fast becoming a

global village and "a ~~single~~ single place"

(5) Attitude of muslim Countries :-

World is becoming a global village, adopting modern innovation and working in the field of science on the other hand some muslim countries rejected modern science as "corrupt foreign thought".
* "Some consider it incompatible with Islamic teachings."

Lack of funds :-

Due to above mentioned orthodox thoughts many muslim countries don't allocate sufficient funds to support scientific research and development.

Quran Support Modern Education.

"Behold in the creation of the heavens and the earth and see how the beings like alternation of night and day, there are indeed signs for men of understanding"

This verse is clearly call of the Quran

3: Political Disunity :-

- * The sectarian quarrel among the Muslim nations is obvious.
- * They are unable to unite due to ideological differences. The Muslim world is not a monolithic entity and there are ideological differences that have impeded cooperation and collaboration on intellectual projects.

Quran:-

"The believers are but a single brotherhood"

(Surah Al-Hujarat)

Result of disunity :-

- * undeveloped
- * poor / poverty
- * unskilled
- * uneducated

The muslim world must encourage collaboration and cooperation among themselves.

4: Rich in Resources but Poor in Management:-

* many muslim countries are blessed with rich resources yet they are unable to put such resources to ~~use~~ defend Islam and Muslims against those who conspicuously conspire against the Muslims.

* Many ~~muslims~~ spending in education, science and social sectors development is negligible.

Fundamentalism Versus Extremism

Another internal challenge faced by Muslim in this contemporary world is fundamentalism and Extremism.

Fundamentalism:-

refers to a strict and literal interpretation of religious text, often involving a rejection of modern or secular ideas and practices. If Islam appears rigid and doctrinaire, it is because the learned interpreters make it so.

- * harsh
- * intolerant
- * Muslim were exhorted to adhere to interpretation which are no longer adequate or relevant.

Extremism:-

refers to an extreme or radical interpretation of a particular ideology, which may or may not be religious in nature.

Note:-

They both promote

- * intolerance
- * divisiveness

* undermining democratic values and human rights.

- * Muslim world is badly lacking in scientific and technological advancement.
- * Dependant on the U.S., China, Germany, Japan etc. for military and IT requirement.
- * 8500 universities in India
5000 in America.

Q: Failure to portray real Image of Islam :-

Example :-
