The limitation of Bentham explain way and be gauged by his dismissal of all poetry (and most religion) as "misrepresentation; this is his negative side. But benevolence and veracity are Supreme Values, and if it this is one of the deniers to be their special advocate, the believers must have long falls to drowsed. Bentham believes the Church teaches children insincerity by making them affirm what they cannot possibly understand or mean. They promise, for example, to fulfill the undertaking of their god---parents, that they will "renounce the devil and all his works, the pomps and vanity of this wicked world" etc. "The Devil" Bentham comments: " who or what is he, and how is it that he is renounced?" Has the child happened to have any dealings with him? Let the Archbishop of Canterbury tell us, and let him further explain how his own "works" are distinguished from the aforesaid Pomps and Vanity".
