due to the modern intensification of morality. We must learn to recognise moral excesses. I shall suggest that modern nihilism is a moral excess from which we are suffering today. And I shall try to look past this stage and see whether there is in fact anything beyond it. For our passion for nihilistic self-doubt may be incurable, and it may come to an end only when it has finally destroyed our civilisation. To speak of moral passions is something new. Writers on ethics, both ancient and modern, have defined morality as a composed state of mind. So novel is the present state of morality that it has been overlooked by all writers on ethics. The idea that morality consists in imposing on ourselves the curb of moral commands is so ingrained in us that we simply cannot see that the moral need of our time is, on the contrary, to curb our inordinate moral demands which precipitate us into moral degradation and threaten us with bodily destruction.
