2) Narrow and Broader view of International relations

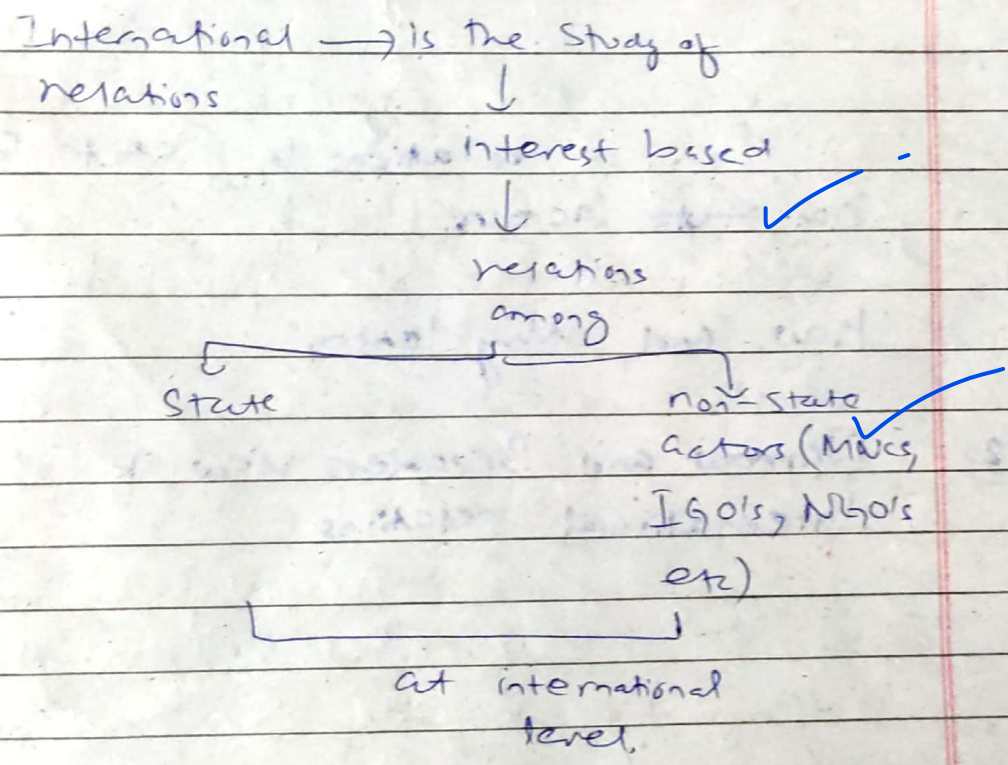
According to narrow view, it is defined as relations b/w States while, on the other hand according to broader view it is defined as relation b/w State & non-State actors.

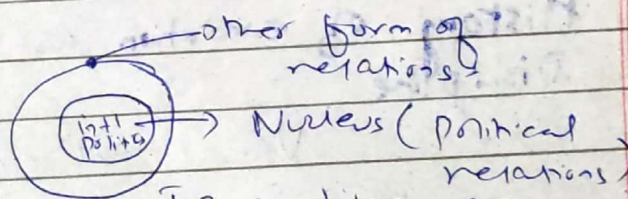

Hans Morganthu believe that core of IR is international politics.

8) Opposite view to Hans:

Palmer and Perkins believe that it is not always the case that political relations define the other relations. They believe that sometimes other relations shape the nature of political relations.

9) Nature of Subject:

It is multi-disciplinary field. It has gather aspect of Geography, politics, Psychology, history, philosophy and cultural studies. Previously, mostly foreign offices were involved in decision-making process. However, now public opinion also shapes the foreign policy of the country.

Nature of subject evolved especially after WWII, four post war factors played major role.

1) International Political Institution

After WWII, various political institution formed at international

at level. like UN, SAARC, that has resulted in cooperation among States.

b) Advent of Nuclear age

It brought the concept of balance of terror and has reduced the frequency of conventional war.

c) Era of economic dependence

It has shifted focus toward soft power. Bretton Wood institutions has established.

d) Advent of Information Age

It has increased level of communication. Now, agreements are of not only a matter of secrecy between state rather it has individual and society is also ~~more~~ important in determining relations.

10) Scope of IR:-

It covers wide range of subjects such as foreign policy, international society, international political economy, political institutions at international level, terrorism, human rights, diplomacy, conflict or war, regional security,

foreign intervention, sovereignty and globalization etc.
