Introduction: Many approaches have practiced by different scholars, activists and organizations for comen's development, but there are three main approaches in women? development Hot Have uprised women's status throughout the world and these three appraches played an important role in providing basic needs and services to wormen women - Nomen in development (NID) focused on

integrating women into existing development structures & policies Nomen and development (WAD) and focused on recognition of women as agent of change rather than passive beneficiaries of development. Then, after WID and WAD, Grender and development approach arised and it towed on rights of all genders and inticized WID and WAD for women - All these three approaches have also beend criticized in history but as and whole they talled in raising standards of women and in providing equal apportunities for all genders.

2. Role of NID in women's development:-Nomen in development was coined in early 1970. by a network of female development professionals in the US who challenged the idea that economic development had equal women . They argued that modernization and wom economic development has just raised men's status not women's status. So there should be comen's integration in existing development models and their excess to education, employment. and politics should be increased. NID was influenced by liberal feminism and supported by UN and some

other agencies. Many projects were launched for women development Dat the project that use WID approach The Malawi Women in Development Project: This project was funded by the African development bank, which laims to strengthen and build the capacities of roral women in literacy & economic aspects The Shell Global Wind Projects:-This project involve women in the development and operation of offshore wind farms in various countries such as Netherland EI USA. The second project was
