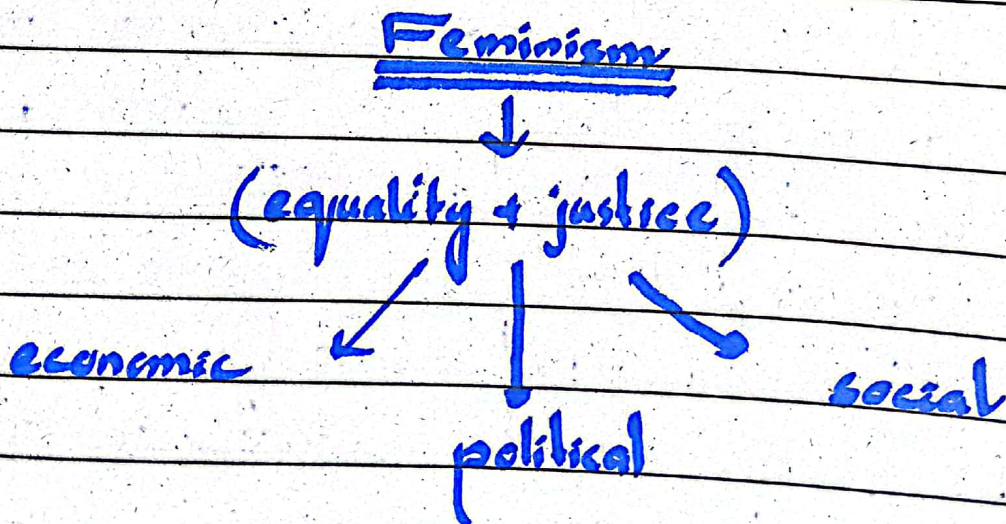


2- Concept of feminism: The New York Times

“patriarchal mindsets.”

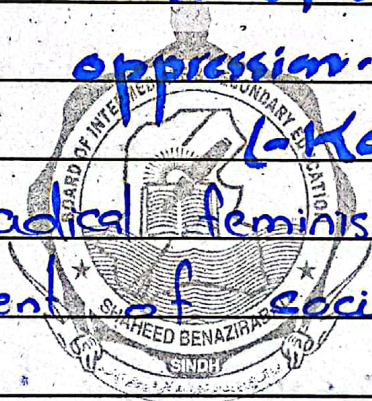
(Kate Millet, 1970)

d) Success of 'liberal' and 'radical' feminism

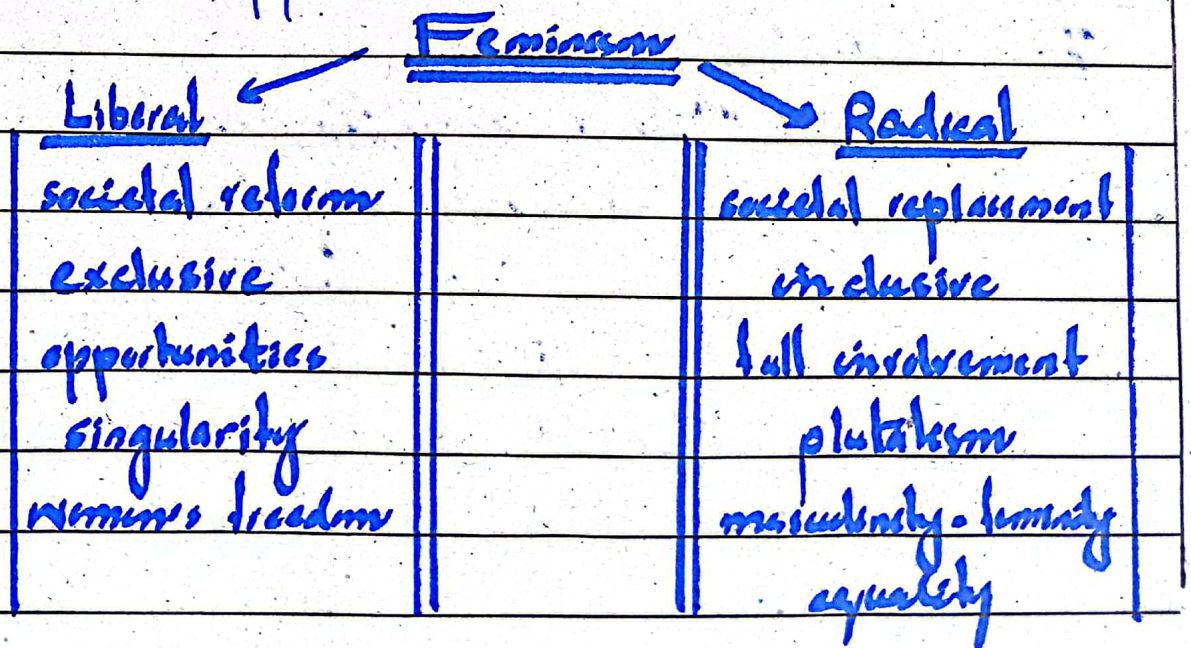
Moreover, both feminisms have different successful mechanisms.
