2- Concept of nationality

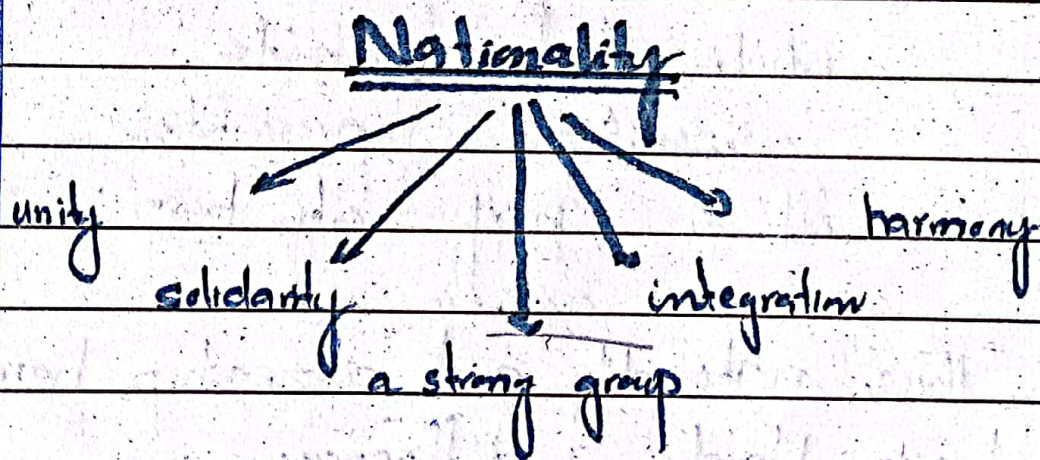
"Nationality is union of all for our domestic land."

3. Main difference between nationality and citizenship

a) Basic literal meaning difference
