Deen is a source of guidance for Mankind:

One of the most important function of Deen is that it guides in both personal and social issues. Islam as Deen has a Divine source for seeking guidance i.e. Quran. The Holy book of Quran is not for muslims only rather it was given to all mankind. Allah (swt) states:

things and action such as they cannot eat the dead meat pigs or drink alcohol and they cannot lie and deceive. These evil things have clearly distinguished by Allah who in Quran says:

It is God who has sent down the book which is truth and balances to judge between right and wrong- (Al Quran)

The reason Deen is different from religion is that it provides its believers not only spiritual cure but social also. For example: Islam has a series of exhaustive judicial, economical and political systems making a clear path for muslims.

For economics, Islamic system of Zabat serves best. Not only does it lessen accumulation of wealth but it also alleviate poverty.

Deen is based on equality principle:


