Pakistan's strategic location requires a robust defense posture, including the management of its nuclear arsenal. Pakistan's Nuclear Policy: A minimum credible deterrence includes, "The military stewardship of nuclear deterrence is crucial for maintaining regional stability and preventing escalation in volatile neighbourhood".

The military's involvement in strategic deterrence is crucial, but so is the civilian government's role in shaping broader foreign policy. A pragmatic civil-military relations ensure that defense policies are not only strong but also aligned with country's diplomatic objectives, contributing to regional security.

#### 4. Political Stability And Governance

Balance of power between civilian government and military also influences political stability in Pakistan.

Since its inception, civilian government struggled on the issues of legitimacy, partly due to military. Stephen Cohen discusses in *The Idea of Pakistan* that "The civil-military divide has been a persistent challenge

to Pakistan's political evolution, with the military often acting as a de facto power broker." For Pakistan

to function as true power democracy, the military must operate within the bounds set by civilian

authorities. A pragmatic civil-military relationship ensures the strength of civil institutions, resulting in a healthy, functioning democracy.

## 5. Economic Implications of Civil-Military Relations

The military's involvement in Pak's economy through various foundations and enterprises has significant implications for national development. While they contribute to country's economy, they also blur the lines between civilian and military domains. A study by Aysha Siddiqua reveals that 'The military's economic ventures have created a parallel economy' that complicates the state's ability to implement coherent economic policies. Whereas civilian govt is involved in all economic development matter including both internal projects and dealings on international level. Therefore, A pragmatic approach allows for greater civilian oversight and control of the economy, leading to more coherent and effective economic governance.

## 6. Implications On South Asia Stability

Pakistan's civil-military relations is not only a domestic matter but have significant contribution in regional stability in South Asia. The rivalry with India, tensions with Afghanistan, and the
