1) Introduction

The formulation of ideology of Pakistan is an evolutionary process. Different events leads to the intellectual consciousness of the Muslims and realization of their separate identity.

Reformists like Sir Syed Ahmed Khan, Allam Iqbal and Quaid-e-Azam played a crucial role in this context. Role of Hindus, political, social, cultural differences and economic disparities leads to the idea of two nation theory.

This idea of existence of two-nations in sub-continent was realized by Al-Beruni far before than Muslims of India in 1017 CE.

2) Definition of Ideology

a) Urdu - Hindi Controversy (1867)

Urdu was a second dominant language after Persian in Subcontinent. The debate emerged on the matter that which language should be the official language of Northern India.

Advocates of Hindi language began promoting Hindi and language riots led to increase in regional conflicts.

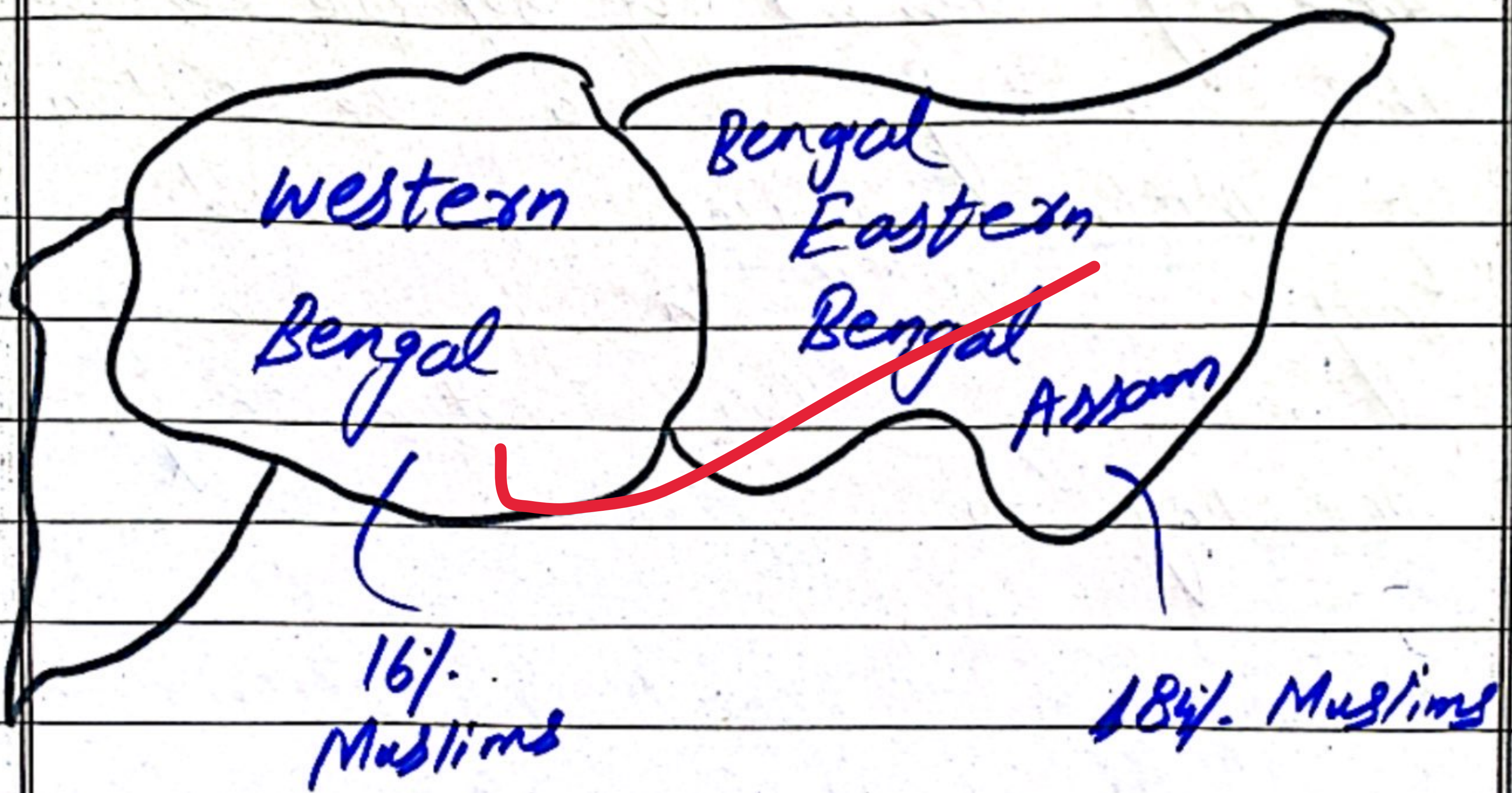
For Muslims it was not the matter of just language but Islamic identity. So they also promoted their language. Urdu Hindi controversy change the perspective of Sir Syed Ahmed Khan who used to think Hindus and Muslims are two eyes of same side.

“I look to Hindus and Muslims with the same eye, these are two eyes of the same side”

After this controversy and war of 1857 he began his Educational efforts and efforts to preserve Muslims identity.

b) Partition of Bengal and Formation of Muslim League



In 1905, Lord Curzon (Viceroy of India) separated the eastern Bengal (Bengal and Assam) with majority Muslim population and western Bengal with majority of Hindus with the intend of better administration.

Reaction to partition:- Hindus vehemently criticized the partition, criticism on partition led to the

realization of muslim leaders that Hindus and Indian national congress are not going to protect muslims rights.

All the muslim leaders under the leadership of Sir Agha Khan met the new viceroy of India Lord Minto and voiced the community demand of separate electorate this meeting led to the creation of Muslim League. That played a major role in formulation of Idea of Two nation theory

According to Hassan Askari Rizvi

“language and position of bengal played an important role in shaping muslim identity and setting political boundaries”

Sir-Syed Ahmed Khan

Sir Syed Ahmed Khan played an important role through his educational reforms and preservation of muslims

identity. He encouraged Muslims to get the modern education and laid the foundation of

Muhamadan-Anglo-oriental college in 1915 which later became Aligarh University.

He promoted the learning of modern science and English Education.

His work was to strengthen the position of Muslims and gave the concept of two nation theory.

"I am convinced that these two nations (Hindus and Muslims) cannot join in anything. At present there is no open animosity between two but on the account of so called educated people it will increase with the passage of time."
