

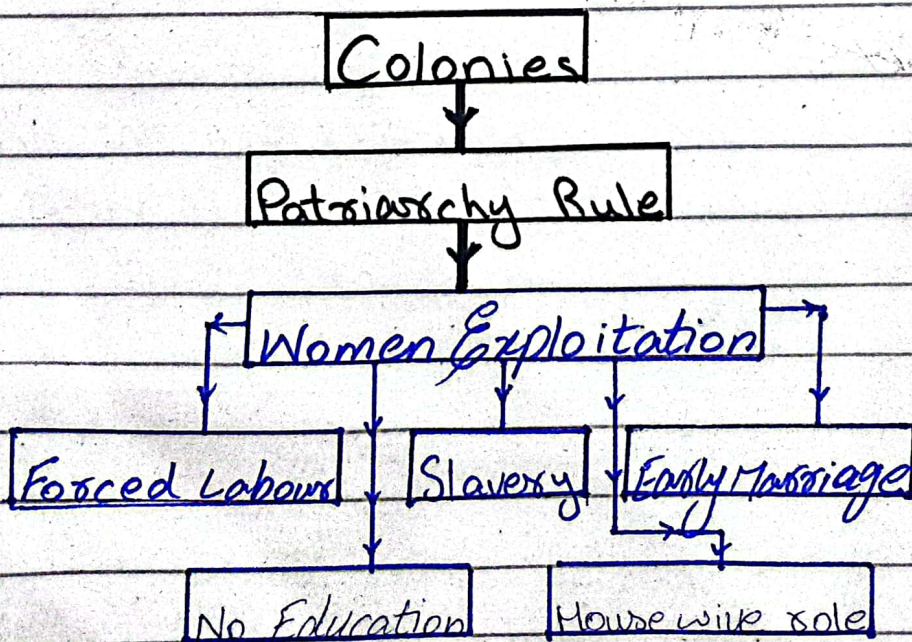
Detailed note on the colonial and capitalistic perspective of gender

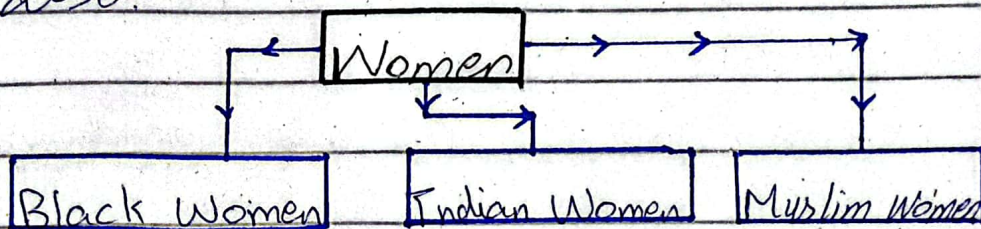
