Overview of the Origin of human rights in the West and Islam:

Western concept of
human rights goes back
to Magna Carta in 1215.

of the rights to his peasants.

thereby, and culminated
in the form of Universal
Declaration of Human Rights
(UDHR) in 1948. While Muslims
did not struggle for these
rights. Allah has bestowed
those rights in 23 years
of ^{the} revelation of the Holy Quran.
Thus, the Muslims' concept
of Human rights goes back
to 1400 years ago, much before
the Magna Carta.

Fundamental Human Rights in Islam:

Some of the fundamental human rights in Islam is as follow:

① Human Equality:

In Islam there is Human equality. All people are equal. As Allah has said in the Holy Quran:

"We have created humans from one male and female and made them into tribes so that they recognize each other. Indeed, the best believer in the sight of Allah is the one who is more God fearing." [Al-Quran].

"Certainly, we have honoured the children of Adam." [Al-Quran]

④ Freedom of Religion:

Islam gives everyone the freedom of Religion. Allah says in the Holy Quran:

"There is no compulsion in religion." [Al-Quran]

"For you is your religion, for them is theirs." [Al-Quran].

⑤ Right to education:

Islam also provides the right of education. As mentioned in the Hadith:

"Seek knowledge from birth till you die."

"Stand firm for Justice as witnesses for Allah, even if it is against yourself, your parents and your relatives." [AI-Quran].

① Rights and duties of Spouses:

It is the duty of the husband to treat his wife fairly as mentioned in the Quran.

"Women should look after the house in the absence of their husbands and protect their chastity."
[Al-Hadith].

② Rights and Duties of Parents:

It is the right of the parents that their children look after them in the old age. As it has been mentioned in the Hadith the context of which is given by:

"Treat your parents with kindness when they reach an old age". [Hadith].

Similarly, it is the duty of parents to not kill their children and inculcates good manners in them.

"Indeed lost are they who have killed their children." [Al-Quran].

Differences in the concept of human rights in the West and Islam:

In the west human rights are guaranteed by the parliament and are flexible in nature. In Islam, human rights are granted by Allah, no body on the earth can revoke it, and are not flexible. Despite the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), there is still the violation of human rights in the Gaza. It means there is difference in the manifestation and application of human

rights in the west. Moreover, the western concept of human rights does not extend to the non-signatory countries. On the other hand, the Islamic concept of human rights are universal and non-discriminatory.

Dignity of Human Rights in IslamAnswerIntroduction:

Similarly, Islam gives dignity to human beings by teaching them knowledge and ask angels to prostrate before them. Moreover, Islam dignifies humans by calling them vicegerent of Allah on the earth.

Along with this Islam gives the concept of human equality which increases the dignity of humans. However, other religions in the world does not provide human dignity to all without discrimination.

Literal meaning of Dignity:

The word "dignity" derives from the Latin word, dignitas, which means "the quality of being worthy and "honourable".

Islamic Concept of human dignity:

The entire philosophy of Islam is based on the human dignity without any discrimination.

① Human beings are the crown of creatures:

Allah has exalted human beings over all his other creatures. As Allah said in the Holy Quran:

"Certainly, we have created humans in the best form" [Al-Quran].

② Endowment Right to knowledge:

"Say in the name of your Lord who created you from the clot of blood. He taught you with the pen and taught you what you did not know" [Al-Quran]

Human beings are dignified by Allah as Angels prostrated before Adam. As Allah said in the Quran the context of which is given by:

"We asked Angels to prostrate before Adam and they obeyed" [Al-Quran].

"We have created humans from one soul" (Al-Quran).

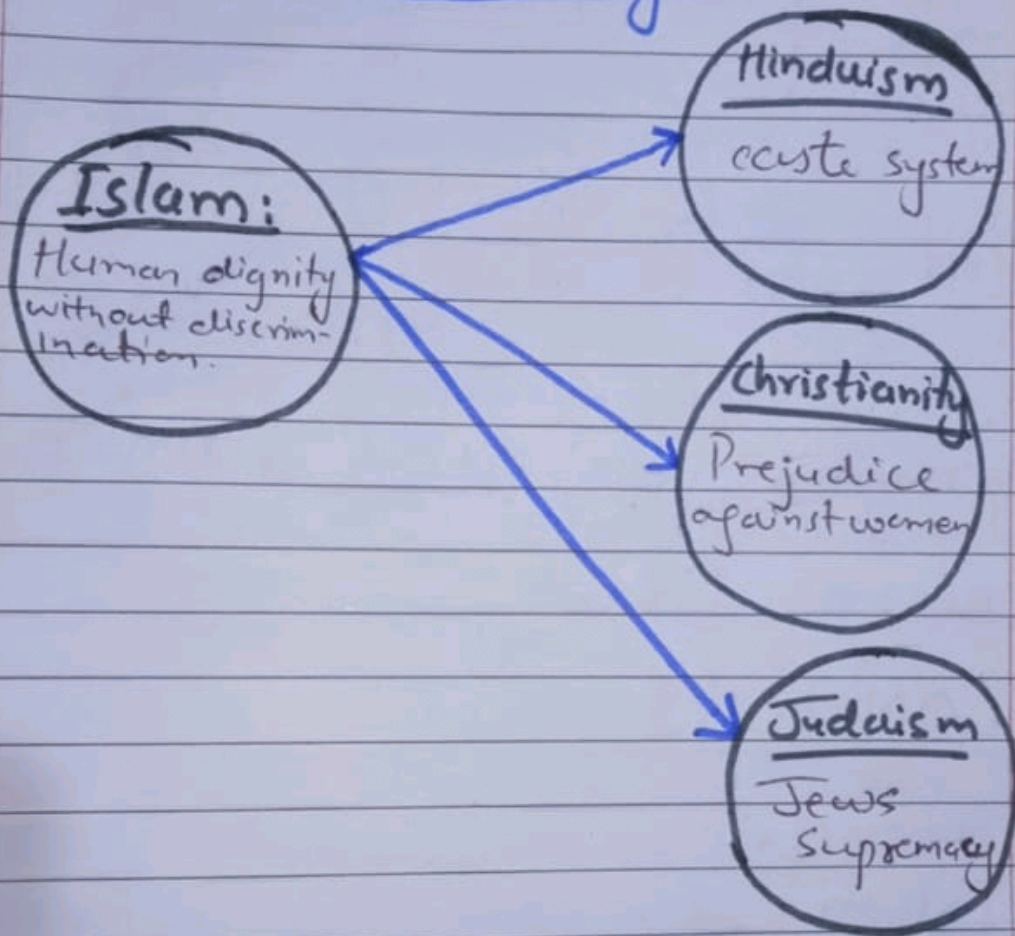
6 Humans are subservient to Allah only:
