
01. INTRODUCTION

2. Community Services Rendered By Allama Iqbal And Quaid e- Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah For The Muslim Of Subcontinent

(a) Educational Reforms And Advocacy For Muslims.

Iqbal recognized education as the cornerstone of progress. He emphasized modern and Islamic education to prepare Muslims for leadership roles in society. He supported Aligarh Muslim University to promote higher education among Muslims. He advocated for scientific and technological learning without compromising Islamic values. He stated that

"Nations are born in the hearts of poets; they prosper in the hands of intellectual."

(c) Economic Empowerment

Iqbal stressed the need for Muslims to achieve economic independence and avoid reliance on others.

He supported the formation of Muslim-owned banks and businesses to strengthen the Muslim economy.

He advocated policies to improve trade and agriculture for Muslim farmers. Iqbal's emphasis on economic independence motivated Muslims to strive for financial stability, thus ensuring social progress.

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Awakening Muslim Identity And Self-Respect

Allama Iqbal worked tirelessly to revive the Muslim spirit, which was suppressed after the fall of the Mughal Empire. Through his poetry and philosophical writings, he emphasized self-respect, self-reliance, and unity among Muslims.

He said:

وہ کہتا ہے کہ انسانیت کا یہ حق ہے کہ
خدا کی عبادت سے خود کو جوڑے یا پرہیزگاری سے۔

His ideas inspired Muslims to rise above despair and work for their collective welfare, reinforcing confidence in their cultural and religious identity.

(d) Religious Revivalism And Islamic Philosophy

Iqbal revitalized Islamic teachings and provided a philosophical foundation for Muslims to reconnect with their faith. He highlighted Islamic values in modern governance and law. He inspired Muslims to lead morally and spiritually enriched lives.

His famously state is:

"Islam is itself destiny and will not suffer destiny."

(a) Legal And Political Advocacy For Muslim Rights

Jinnah dedicated his life to defending Muslim rights through legal and constitutional means. He fought against discriminatory laws and supported muslim representation in political councils and demanded separate electorates to preserve their identity.

He advocated two-Nation-Theory, highlighted the cultural and religious differences between Hindus and Muslims.

He said;

"We are nation with our distinctive culture, civilization, and religion."

(b) Establishment Of Educational And Welfare Institutions

Jinnah believed education was the key to Muslim empowerment. He supported the expansion of Aligarh university and other educational institutions. He also promoted women's education and participation in public life. His efforts laid the foundation for an educated Muslim middle class, capable of leading the community.

(c) Economic Development For Muslims

Jinnah prioritized economic upliftment to free Muslims from poverty and exploitation. He encouraged Muslims to invest in businesses and industries.

He established welfare programs for orphans and widows through trusts and charities. He said,

"With faith, discipline and selfless devotion, there is nothing worthwhile that you cannot achieve."

(d) Social And Religious Freedom

Jinnah was committed to safeguarding religious and cultural freedoms for Muslims. He ensured minority rights within Pakistan, granting freedom of worship and equality to all citizens. He advocated for Islamic values as the foundation of social justice and fairness. He said;

You are free to go your temples, mosques, or any other place of worship in the state of Pakistan.

Iqbal inspired unity and identity, while Jinnah turned his vision into reality through political and social reforms.
