1. Political Inclusivity leads to human development in marginalised regions.

Case in Point: Indian public witnesses development (largest democracy) regardless of widespread poverty.

2. ~~Better pay scales of this argument~~ prevailing inflation trends are merely myopic solutions.

Case in Point: Despite 10 month low inflation (4.9%) Pakistan ranks 163 out of 193 on HDI.

3. Better health and education facilities anchor the development of a society.

Case in Point: Scandinavian Countries.

4. Technologically advanced nations can compete with global dynamic trends.

Case in Point: India has managed to become a regional hegemon due to advances in the IT sector.

5. Environmental Sustainability would result in better standard of life.

Case in Point: Japan navigated all efforts to mitigate effects of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

6. Better Rule of Law and provision of justice can ensure a less-crime prone society.

Case in Point: Pakistan ranks third worst (139/142) for law and order (WJP Report), hence no signs of development.

7. Provision of Human Rights are cornerstone of development.

Case in Point: Myanmar faces worst HR exploitations and lacks real development.

8. Gender Inclusivity is a pre-requisite for development.

Case in Point: Women in USA (world's largest economy) do not account political or social equality necessary for development.

9. Freedom of Press can transform lives.

Case in Point: China has extensive bans on the press - not a developed society but economy.

10. Civil Society and NGOs must be empowered.

Case in Point: South Korea (civil society forced president to step-down from imposing martial law).
