

The second part of Kalma describes that Allah has provided guidance for human beings. He has revealed His guidance through His Prophets and messengers and Muhammad (PBUH) was the last prophet.

2. Prophethood

The second basic feature of Islamic faith is to believe in the Prophethood of Muhammad (PBUH) and in the guidance which he bequeathed.

Surah Al-Anbiya : 40

"Muhammad (PBUH) is not the father of any of your men, but is the Messenger of Allah and the seal of the prophets."

Dr. Khurshid Ahmed in his book "Islam: its meaning and message" says,

"To believe in Muhammad (PBUH) means to accept his authority as representative of the Supreme Ruler and to follow his example in thought and behaviour."

3. Complete code of life.

Islam provides us the complete code of life. However, other than Islam, none of the other monotheist religious guides us in each and every way. Therefore, they are called religious and Islam is referred as 'Din'.

Islam guides us at every step of life. From the day we are born till the last breath.

"Indeed, the religion in the sight of Allah is Islam."

7. Islam is simple, natural and practical

Islam is the only religion which is free from irrelevant myths. It is free from superstitions. The three basic beliefs: unity of God, prophethood of Holy Prophet (PBUH) and the life-after-death, are based on reason and logic. Everybody can approach Quran and follow the given teachings. To follow and to practice the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) is as necessary as these basic beliefs.

"God does not accept belief, if it is not expressed in deeds, and does not accept deeds, if they don't confirm to belief."

8. Unity of Matter and Spirit

This is a unique feature of Islam, that neither it denies the importance of material needs nor does it denies the importance of spiritual needs. Humans are advised to pray:

"Our Lord! Give us the good in this world and the good in the hereafter." 2:201

Allah (SWT) also advises human beings to eat and drink. However, in Quran He mentions: "do not exceed". Thus, Islam signifies the value of moderation.

Salient Features of Islam

The first part of the Kalima
signifies the unique concept of Unity
of God which in other words is called
Tawhid. In fact, the first Kalima itself
is named as 'Tawhid'.

1. TAWHID

Tawhid is the core pillar of Islam
and is also called 'The Bed Rock of Islam'.
It means that there is no God except
Allah (swt). He is the Creator and Sustainer
of the whole world.

According to Surah Baqarah, Allah says,

"And Allah is All-Hearing, All-Knowing".

In other words, Islam is like a fort and
a gate of that fort is Tawhid. An individual
has to profess in order to become a

serve the soul which the soul can enjoy and relish. Performing religious duties like offering prayers, observing fasts, paying Zakat, performing Hajj, etc., help a man in attaining spirituality.

14. Practice of Social Services

Another important feature of Islam is that it orders to serve the respective society. A Muslim must pay Zakat to the needy ones, they should give charity as well, in order to serve the community.

These features have appealed to many people in the past and present and these will continue to appeal to the man of future as well. Hence, it is concluded that Islam is the religion of truth and the right path for mankind.

4. Teachings of Good morals.

Another striking feature of Islam is the preaching of good morals and virtues. These will help a Muslim to build his character in a way which Allah (SWT) describes through Qura'an and through the teachings of Prophet (PBUH).

Surah Bani Israel: 32

"And do not commit adultery for, behold, it is an abomination and an evil way."

5. Reverence for Knowledge and Education.

In the modern times, the world has acknowledged the fact that nothing equals knowledge. We acquire knowledge through education. (Muhammad PBUH) was sent to educate and guide the Arabs and

the entire world.

Hazrat Muhammad (PBUH) said,

"Acquiring the knowledge is must for every Muslim!"

6. Concept of Life-after-death.

Allah has given a choice to human being whether to follow 'Islam' or to refuse it. Now, the question arises those who don't accept 'Islam' as a 'din' and 'religion', what will happen to them. Therefore, this unique concept solves this problem.

This concept is one of the fundamental dogma of Islamic beliefs. Life on earth, will, one day, come to an end. Death is inevitable. And it will be in this Life-after-death that man will be awarded or punished. "Every soul shall taste death." 3:185

Q* What is Islam? Discuss the salient features of Islam.

Answer: 'Islam' is an arabic word and it is derived from the root word 'SLM' or 'Salm'. According to the root word, Islam means "to surrender, or to submit or to resign oneself to the will of Allah (swt)".

Another meaning of Islam is 'to make peace' or 'to reconcile with one another'. Therefore, Islam means "to enter in peace by submitting to the will of God".

Dr Hamidullah says,
"Islam is the monotheistic deen which was revealed upon Holy Prophet (PBUH)".

Basic concept of Islam

The basic concept of Islam is that this whole universe is created by Allah (swt). He has created man in the perfect form and every man has a fixed period of life which he has to spend on Earth. For man's guidance, He has sent many messengers and prophets. Therefore, man has been given a choice whether to follow Islam or to refuse it. Those who follow Islamic code are called Believers (Musliman) and those who refuse to accept it are called Non-believers (kafir).

An individual has to recite Kalma Tawhid in order to become a believer. This Kalma represents the two
