

Role of International law in sovereignty of a state

Binding rules for persons are exercised through court law and for state through international law. Laws for state are not influenced by society but by imposed restrictions of Int. Community. Individual's laws are binding but state's laws are not compulsory. There is objection of lawyers expertise over this least effective legal system. Presence of binding rules make any state less sovereign. But theory of consent opposed it and stated that sovereignty of state depends on their behaviour towards binding rules.
