There is no denying the fact that a child having different sorts of matter in his/her mind cannot focus on their physical and mental growth. The same is quite prevalent in the contemporary world, and many of the developing countries are adversely affected by the menace. Hundreds of millions of children the world over are engaged in child labor at the expense of the leisure of their childhood. There are several underlying reasons which lead to the criminal neglect of child labor. There is no political will to counter the problem. No economic incentives are in place to avert the dangerous repercussions of child labor. Similarly, there is acceptance in some societies of rampant child labor. Likewise, education plays minimal role in doing away with the issue. Also, the burgeoning population leads to neglect of child labor. Owing to these reasons of neglect of child labor, certain

repercussions are evident of impacts both for individual child labor and their nations at large. As far as the nations are concerned, they face bad image internationally. They also find themselves suffering from economic downturn. Also, in such countries, social evils in various forms are the order of the day. Similarly, such children are considered burden on the already growing population. As far as the impacts on individual children are concerned, they face hardships in finding respectable profession in later stages. Their health is also deteriorated, and they build inclination towards criminal activities and hence irresponsible citizens. However, the challenge can be confronted by taking various measures. First and foremost, it is the duty of politicians to handle the issue. Economic incentives to the children can also thwart the conundrum. Effective law enforcement should be in place. Last but not the least, the role of education really comes in handy in dealing with the menace of child labor. The discussion goes on, and certainly there has been a perpetual neglect of child labor in the world. It has negative consequences for both the nations and the children. 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The conundrum can be minimized.

That there has been a criminal neglect of child labor is evident from the study of human history, both in past and the present. The onset of various techniques such as agriculture and industries led men to enslave certain vulnerable portion of the communities. Children have been one of such vulnerable communities. It is evident from the fact that even in today's developed world, 160 million children the world over are engaged in Child Labour according to the ILO, 201, International Year for the Eradication of Child Labor.

This is quite a headache in most of the developing countries of the world. Pakistan is one of such countries suffering from the menace. As a law of nature, the uncontrolled child labor leads to severe repercussions to the world. It impacts both the individual child labor and the states.

Recognizing the grim reality, the UNICEF convened a convention on Children right in 1989. In spite of the presence of such organization, the child labor could not be controlled, as it poses threat to the contemporary world, owing to certain reasons.

To begin with, lack of political will is a preventive measure of child labor has always remained a reason behind its criminal neglect. The politicians do not wake up to the grim reality and its consequences. In spite of having a number of domestic laws and many international conventions, the issue has not been resolved as yet. Every country has certain set of procedure for eliminating that form of slavery from the society. As an example of such domestic legislation, Article 41 of the Constitution of Pakistan prohibits slavery and forced labor under 14 years in hazardous conditions. But, the result is zilch. Similarly, Pakistan, along with the other countries suffering from the problem are signatories to a number of international agreements on eradicating child labor. Also, there are no proper surveys regarding the exact number of children engaged in child labor. All these factors make ineffective any effort to eliminate child labor from a country. Hence, lack of political will is a major impediment in the way of doing away with child labor.

Similarly, the dearth of economic incentives for children and their parents is also

responsible for the uncontrolled child labor in today's world. Poverty is the source of all evils.

Studies show that a one percent rise of poverty can lead to at least a 0.7 percent increase in child labor. Such condition leaves very little space for the children to focus on their physical and mental growth. In some families, owing to the death or poor health of male or father, children are forced to do labor work. In Pakistan, along with other regional and Latin American countries, children even under ten years of age are found engaged in child labor. There are no employment opportunities, no social protection programs for such suffering children. According to reports, in such countries a significant portion of the population lives below the poverty line. Hence, lack of economic incentives & opportunities is also a leading factor of child labor.

In the same vein, failure of a society to have checks on child labor is also one of the causes of the grave neglect of the menace. They say culture is an unwritten constitution. At the end of the day, the child labor are

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engaged in labor in ~~not~~ in the vicinity of a society. That is a social acceptance of child labor in some societies. According to the Social Learning theory, a child learns how to live in the society from their counterparts. If the child sees a large number of children engaged in child labor, he/she also develops such an inclination. Also, the lack of data on child labor prevents the society to take action against the problem.

Several cases of injustices with child labor often go unnoticed. In every country suffers from rampant child labor, the role of society has been found to be encouraging, rather than preventing it. So, societal ignorance and acceptability are also one of the major reasons leading to unpreventable child labor in a society.

Most importantly, education sector has also been playing quite an insignificant role in doing away with the conundrum of child labor. Despite being an educated world, the menace of child labor is still there. It occurs in various forms. There is a lack of universal education in most of the affected countries. Even if the

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is a concept of universal education in their constitution, it is not strictly implemented. It is evident in the fact that globally, hundreds of millions of children are out of school, and in Pakistan alone, the number is a staggering 23 million children (IMF). Such children are bound to be engaged in child labor. Also, vocational training facilities are quite non-existent, due to which the children found themselves unskilled, and have participated in child labor. Similarly, role of the higher education in advising the policy makers is also nothing to write home about. Therefore, the superficial role played by education is also a factor why there is a criminal neglect of child labor.

Last but not the least, the burgeoning population in most of the countries is also a factor leading to child birth, and it is consistently being neglected by the states. The world cannot accommodate billions of people, and takes a heavy toll on them. A billion of 8 billion people cannot take care of every of its individual. Similarly, countries like Pakistan, which

has 280 million population at the moment can barely take stock of the condition of every individual, let alone children. It is a headache for almost every developing country.

All the other social indicators are related to it. The fact that millions of children are engaged in child labor is testimony to the fact. Interestingly, the 23 million children out-of-school in Pakistan constitute a population greater than the overall population of many individual countries in the world. So, the rapidly increasing population has also rendered the efforts of preventing child labor quite ineffective and all of the above mentioned factors lead to severe consequences.

Consequently, the neglect of child labor impacts both the nation and the individuals.

As far as the consequence on the states are concerned, first and foremost, it leads to a bad international image of such states which face uncontrolled child labor. It is a case in most of the third world countries of the world. According to the New Global Estimates on Child Labor, International Labor Office,

2015, more than 90 percent of the child labor in the world are from developing countries. From India to Brazil to South Africa and from Pakistan to Bangladesh to Ghana, every developing country suffers from the repercussion of rampant child labor. According to the Human Right Commission of Pakistan, over 12 million children in the country are engaged in child labor. It creates a negative image of the country in today's globalized world. Owing to this factor, countries like India are taking firm actions to thwart child labor in order to improve their image globally. Hence, the unrestrained child labor is a major threat to the image of a country globally.

Similarly, the criminal neglect of child labor also leads to economic downturn of a nation. In today's world, countries having considerable child laborers are facing certain economic challenges. At the end of the day, if it is the skilled children who become productive youth in the later ages. But, if they are deprived of their childhood learning skills, they cannot contribute positively.

to the economy of their nations. They struggle to find employment opportunities in the society. It is a problem mainly with the developing countries, who have been struggling to harness the potential of their youth. Countries such as Japan have good economy just because of their productive youth who are a product of skilled children. Same is the case in Pakistan, which is on the verge of economic downfall just because of the criminal neglect of child prosperity in their early stages. So, the child labor also lead to the economic downfall of a state in the long run.

Likewise, prevalence of societal evils also owe their origin to the grave neglect of child labor. A child becomes a good individual when he is not deprived of his childhood opportunities. On the other hand, when they are engaged in child labor, they forget the societal norms and participate in certain evils, which become difficult to the state institution to handle. Environment of insecurity is found in the society. The rampant cases of rape and harassment also have their origin to a larger extent, in the neglect

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of the personality of the children. When there is such an environment, the other children especially gender-specific children feel insecure in the society, and the society becomes notorious for social evils. It is the case in almost all the backward societies and nations of the world. The crime rates are highest in sub-Saharan, Latin America, and the deprived nation of Asia. Therefore it is safe to say that the criminal neglect of child labor makes a society insecure and gives birth to many societal evils.

Also, the children labor become a burden on the already growing population. It is wrongly perceived in some societies that more children will put more food on the table of the families. But, the case is quite opposite. Due to the lack of policies on curbing exploding population, the menace of child labor goes unnoticed, which, in turn, becomes more burden on the population.

Such children do not play their due role due to their deprivation in the childhood. They resort to great pasture of other part of the world if suffer from labor works. There is well. As a

example, millions of Pakistani workers resort to the middle eastern oil-rich countries. Why they feel that they are burden on these countries & that they will not be able to find profession in their mother country. They also face the hardships of laborious in the target countries. Inspite of becoming an asset for the country, such as growing population becomes a liability for them. Therefore, as in other field, the criminal neglect of child labor also becomes a burden on the already growing population of the affected countries.

As far as the repercussions of the neglect of child labor to the individual children are concerned, first of all, it becomes troublesome for the children to find respectable profession at the later stage of their lives. What a person becomes in the life stages depend upon what he learns in his early childhood. So, when a child is deprived of proper school and learns in the childhood, he/she struggles to find a good profession in his/her youthful age. It just adds to the menace of unemployment. In turn, it suffers from the problem of uncontrolled

child labor, the youth is found to be mostly unproductive. They resort to some other form of activity in order to make their ends meet. They are not regarded as respectable either. They bear the brunt of the behavior of the people. Such children are constantly labelled as laborer. They also feel disgraced in front of the children of affluent families, and face employed hardships throughout their lives. Hence, the perpetual neglect of child labor affects an individual child greatly when it comes to finding noble professions in their lives.

Most importantly, the neglect of child labor also gives birth to several health repercussions for the children. Their health is compromised greatly. Most of the child labor is engaged in hazardous works. They also face psychological and emotional traumas by the other segments of the society and by the labor counterparts in the factories, agriculture and industry. This fact was also recognized in Article 3(a) of the ILO Convention No. 187, which defined such hazardous

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child labour. Such children are deprived of their childhood pleasures and open eyes to a hazardous environment. They remain to condition throughout their lives. They are tortured physically & psychologically & emotionally. They also inflict harm or violence on their family members, especially gender-based violence against the girls. All of such incidents are interconnected.

Hence, pure continuous neglect of child labor is one of the reasons of the health deterioration of the children engaged in such labor.

Last but not the least, the neglect of child labor turns many child laborers into criminal segments of the society. When they are not properly educated, they grow criminal inclination. According to the Strain Theory of Merton, when society sets goals & does not provide legitimate means to achieve such goals, the people will resort to illegal means to achieve such goals. One such goal in the modern world is wealth. When a child is engaged in child labor during his childhood, they cannot learn to

skills require to amass wealth. They are left with no option but to resort of criminal means to achieve their goals. This is a predicament in almost all the countries of the affected world. As an example according to the Pakistani Minister of Interiors a considerable number of children are being used by the terrorist organizations in order to carry out their malicious campaign.

Hence all of this reflects a testament to the fact that the neglect of child labor makes the children criminally minded in the long run and it is important also to discuss the ways in which the criminal neglect of child labor can be done away with.

Foremost, the politicians can play a significant role in doing away with the child labor. It is the political will which can turn the dream into reality.

As an example, the role of local government representatives in reporting the child labor is of great significance. Often the case of child labor go unnoticed by the central government. It is the local government representatives

who deal with the people at grassroots levels. They can report each and every case of child labor to the central government and plan accordingly. Also if there is proper political will, a number of policies will be made in accordance with the needs of children. Likewise, it is the political will which coordinates among the various institutions of a country to effectively implement any policy regarding the child labor. So the political leaders and government can play most crucial role in dealing with the concern of child labor.

Secondly, certain economic incentives or preventive measures can do away with the long-persisted menace of child labor. The child resort to child labor not out of their free will, but they are compelled by the economic or financial condition of the family to do so. In this era, the parents of the child labor should be provided with proper employment opportunities so they can be no more dependent on their juvenile children. Also part-time respectable jobs can be

provided to the children so they can  
do not have to remain absent from the  
school. However, it is to mention here that  
not all kinds of work or labor done by  
a juvenile constitute child labor. If they  
are engaged in half-day professional activity,  
which do not affect their education at school, it  
is okay. They will be able to help their really  
deserving parents. Hence, provided economic  
incentive to the children & their families can  
prevent the problem of child labor.

Thirdly & most importantly,  
the effective enforcement of laws related  
to child labor can ensure the eradication  
of child labor. Despite of having various  
laws related to children, the result appears  
to be zilch. On that vein, the training of +  
law enforcement agencies is of paramount  
importance. The police, the judicial offices,  
the labor office & probations office should  
be properly trained to enforce the law  
related to the children's rights. It is a  
problem with almost all of the affected

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countries. Pakistan also suffers from the problem of effectively implementing the law related to child labor. In this regard, the Pakistan Penal Code (PPC) should be amended.

Proper chapters related to children right should be introduced in the Constitution among other things. Here, the role of law enforcement agents can eradicate child labor from a country.

Last but not the least, the role of education in eliminating the menace of child labor is of great importance. It is education which makes a person change the vicious cycle of labors of their family. It is education which makes him a respectable person. Coming to the reality, India introduced "National Child Labour Project" (NCLP) in 1988 as a best practice. Under this project, the child laborers are reported from various districts. They are then rehabilitated by the state in varie skilled schools. In short, they are made good citizens by working on them. The same

can be adopted by all countries suffer from criminal neglect of child labor, includes Pakistan. It is through proper vocational training by educational institution that the children will get rid of the laborious Child labor. Hence, education plays an extraordinary role in along <sup>and</sup> with a continuous neglect of child labor.

In conclusion, it is derived that there has been a perpetual neglect of child labor in the world, which, in turn, has led to severe repercussions for both the states and the individual child labors. The states affected face bad govern, bad international image, economic downturn & other societal issues, while the individual child also suffer heavily. His/her health condition get deteriorated.
