4- The Principles of Ijtihad

There are three principles of Ijtihad.

- a. Ijtihad - Fi - Sharh
- b. Ijtihad - Fi - Madhab
- c. Ijtihad - Fi - Masail

a) Ijtihad - Fi - Sharh

Absolute independence in legislation is the gift of God.

He can use his own independence judgement. Theoretically, any muslim can attain this degree, but one of principles of Jurisprudence that of the confirmation of this rank is dependent on many conditions. Following are these conditions :-

- i) He should have perfect acquaintance with literal meaning of the words.
- ii) He must know Quran with all explanations.
- iii) He should have perfect knowledge of Hadith - or atleast thousand of them.
- iv) He himself should be rich.
- v) He also has profound knowledge of all the sciences.
- vi) A complete knowledge of the four schools of Jurisprudence.

b) Ijtihad fi Nadhab

This degree has granted to the immediate disciples of the great Imams who have elaborated the system of their matters.

c) Ijtihad fi Massal

This is the degree of special independence. They can solve cases which come before them, giving reasons for their judgement or decide on case which have not been settled by previous Mujtahidin; but in either case, their decisions must always be in absolute accordance with the opinions of the Mujtahid of the first and second class.
