"About 70 per cent of the Ukrainian population became pro-European."

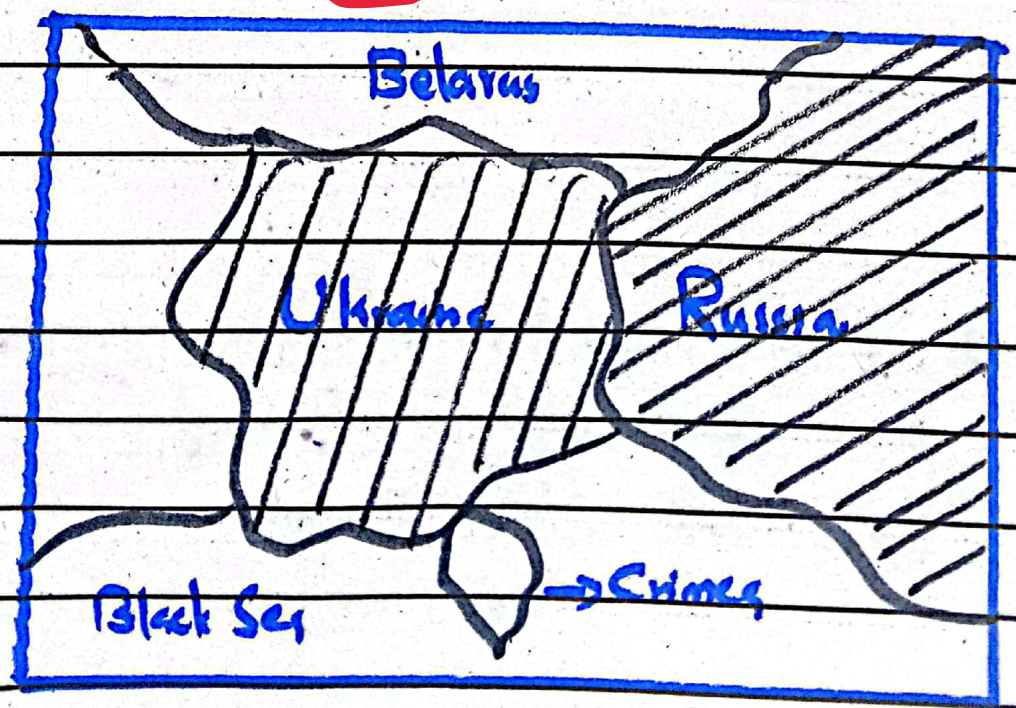

↓ "The Ukraine applied for NATO and EU membership." (www.cfr.org)

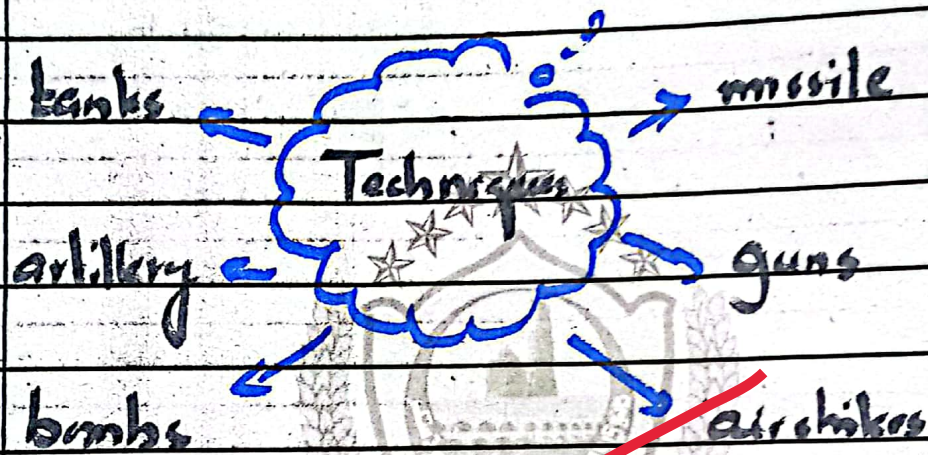
Therefore, membership for NATO and EU by the Ukraine pressurized Russia for attacks.

About 2000 troops were used to to

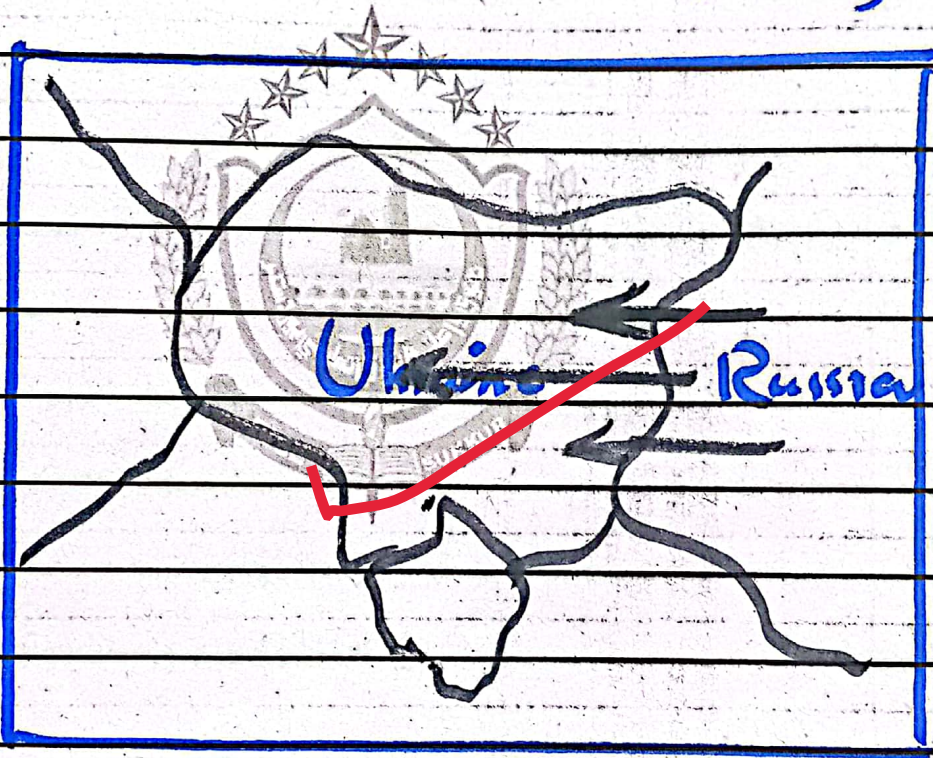
break Eastern and

This shows powerful attack on the Ukraine.

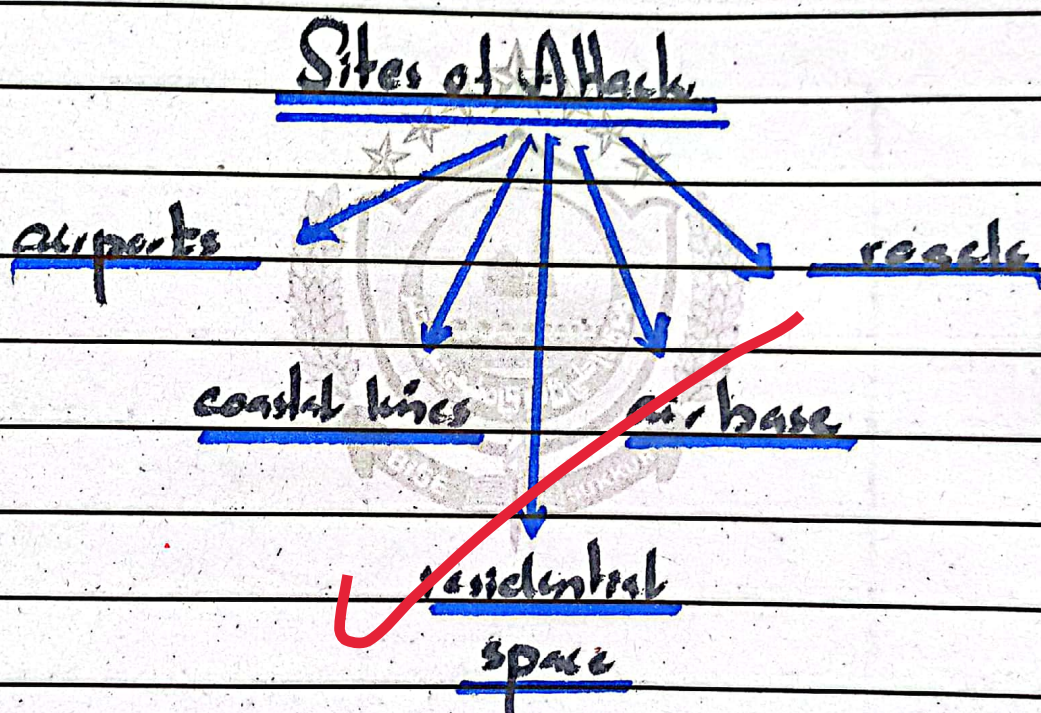
c) Coastal belt of the Ukraine

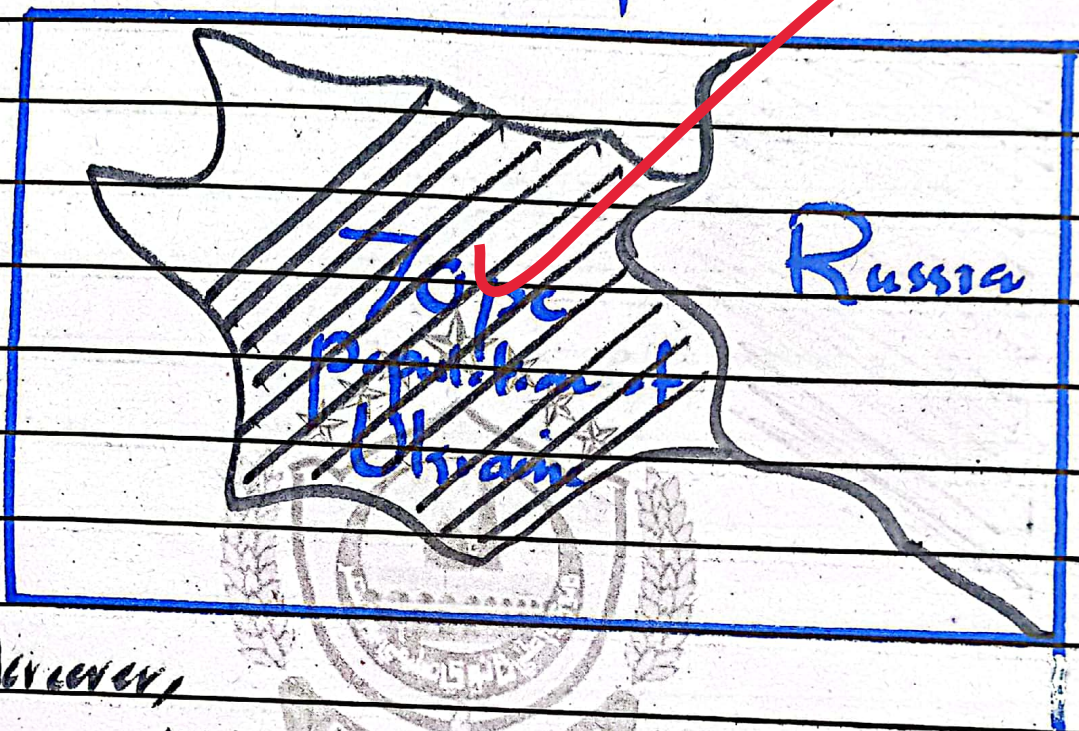
This shows economic impact on the
