Though the time period of materialising SDGs is assumed 2030, but the world is nowhere in achieving gender equal status. According to the latest figures, global gender gap narrowed slightly to 68.6%. But gender equality is still almost a century away. In Pakistan, the status of gender equality is abysmal. Pakistan is performing very poor in gender related indexes for so many years. Currently, Pakistan's gender ranks 142 out of 146 countries.

In addition to this, A Review of women's diagnostic study of niwahmanas in Punjab reports that: 86% of labor's marriage registrar believe, brides are not allowed or competent enough to negotiate terms of niwahmanas. These statistics underscores the need of stringent measures in order to bring Pakistan's untutilized force into economy, politics, and in social development roles. When world is going through fourth industrial revolution, Pakistan can use women for the sustainable development. Comparably, women can do better in economy and politics. For instance, after giving women their rightful rights, America transformed from agrarian society to industrial. Bangladesh is also doing better in this regards, as its women labor participation is 43%, and, on the other

But the only hurdles that are hindering Pakistan from turning into Asian tiger are cultural stereotypes, lack of resources and political will, and ineffective women quota.
