Reason 2: The pay was low / Low paid.

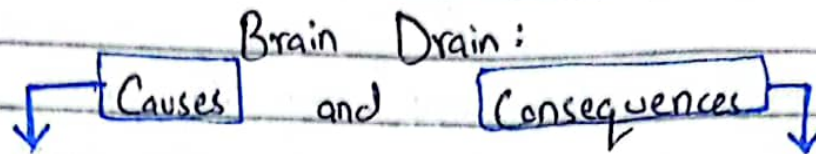
- a. Minimum wage was \$3.65 an hour, plus a quarter extra for working the night shift.
