However, the idea is shrouded in onerous controversy, particularly the one that it is inherently un-Islamic. ~~idea~~ Hopefully, all the stakeholders in the said matter will be taken on board in order to achieve greater good, by implementing the idea.

## Dialogue with Baluch insurgents

## China's concerns

Moreover, Chinese funded infrastructure has been a constant target, more particularly CPEC. At this deteriorating security situation, Chinese side was discontent with Pakistan. To appease it and to demonstrate that the country is bent on obliterating this threat, Pakistan has launched a new military operation called Azm-e-Istehkam. It is broadly being expected that the operation will give impetus to China's democracy mood.

## Iran and KSA

There is every likelihood that the process of friendship between Iran and Saudi Arabia will be derailed as a result of latter's engagements with the USA. For ending their long-standing tussle, which especially intensified after the execution of a Shia cleric in the KSA in 2016, the two old rivals — Iran and Saudi Arabia — have started dialogue process to rebuild bilateral ties. However, there is a great obstacle in the way to achieve this purpose, USA. In past few years, KSA has been pushing hard to stretch a defence agreement with the USA. The agreement is being negotiated and there is good possibility, it will soon be finalized. However, this new bonhomie between USA and KSA will push the latter to stop engaging with Iran — which is a formidable threat to America. Hence, it is true that the closeness between KSA and USA will deepen fissures between Iran and KSA.

## Taxes and Brain drain

The rising tax burden on the masses in Pakistan is leading to the problem of brain drain. The government of Pakistan, under the immense pressure of decreasing/depleting revenues, has decided to expand taxes. It has already raised the taxes at an enormous rate in the recent budget. The salaried class bore the blow of two times higher taxes. The salaried people have been pained by not only increasing the tax rate but also lowering the tax bracket, which is, in more technical words, also called tax slabs. Similarly, the government has raised taxes on products including baby cere and packaged milk. GST on books has also hiked. Amidst this, people are finding it very difficult to reside in Pakistan. The inflation has sky-rocketed, leaving many to face elusiveness in meeting basic needs. Reluctantly, people are exploring and casting around for opportunities abroad in order to escape difficult life in Pakistan.

## Economic instability
