1- Tarnishing of Muslim Image:

2- Economic and Humanitarian Disasters:

Many Muslim-majority countries face economic hardships and humanitarian crises. These challenges are often due to a combination of factors, including poor governance, conflict, and natural disasters. The impact is severe, leading to poverty, hunger, displacement, and a lack of basic services like healthcare and education.

3- Linking Islam with Terrorism:

Islam is frequently and wrongly associated with terrorism, leading to widespread fear and misunderstanding. This association has been perpetuated by certain extremist groups that misrepresent Islamic teachings and by media portrayals that emphasize the negative stereotypes. As a result, Muslims often face unjust scrutiny and prejudice.

4- Lack of Unity:

There is often a lack of unity among Muslims, which hampers collective progress and the ability to address common challenges effectively. Sectarian divisions, political disputes and cultural differences contribute to this fragmentation, weakening the overall strength and influence of the Muslim community.

5- Absence of the Concept of Ummah:

The absence of the concept of Ummah, or the global Muslim community, exacerbates divisiveness. This lack of solidarity and mutual support among Muslims worldwide hinders collective efforts to address common issues and support each other in times of need.

6- High Illiteracy Rates:

1- Enhancing the image of Muslims:

(Quran 2:42)

(Quran 2:143)
