> On Individual level

1. Sense of self-accountability:

When we realize that this world is not permanent it is just an examination hall after this a new life begins where we will be answerable to God for our actions. Where the parts of my body will testify against me roout what you used to do. When I know where this whole thing is going to happen and I had been accountable there. Belief in the Hereafter instills a sense of self-accountability. This belief encourages people to act righteously and avoid sin, knowing that every deed, big or small, will be judged.

"So whoever does an atom's weight of good will see it, and whoever does an atom's weight of evil will see it."

This verse highlights that every action, no matter how small, will be accounted for on the Day of Judgment, reinforcing the concept of self-accountability.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upo I him) said,

"The wise one is he who holds hit iself accountable and works for what comes after death; and the foolign one is he who follows his desires and merely happens upon Allah."

This Hadith emphasizes the importance of self-accountability and preparing for the Hereafter.

2. Helps in leading a maningful life

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

"This world is the believer's prison and the disbeliever's pare dise."

This Hadith illustrates that for believers, this life is a place of trials and preparation for the eternal life to come, giving their actions a meaningful context.

3. Helps in leading a humble life

Whatever happens, I will get the kingdom of the whole world, get as many resources as possible, But all this is limited to this world. "And the servants of the Most M reiful are those who walk upon the earth humbly, and when the ignorant address them [harshly], they say [words of] peace."

This verse describes the characteristics of true believers, highlighting humility as a key trait.

The Prophet Muhammad peace be upon him) said,

"Whoever has in his heart an atom's weight of arrogance will not enter Paradise."

This Hadith underscores the importance of humility and the dangers of arrogance, reinforcing the need for a humble life in pursuit of the Hereafter.

4. Helps in f cing the problems of this life in a brave manner

Allah says in the Quran:

Whenever the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) used to encourage his companions, he used to advise them to be patient. The family of Amar bin Yasir was the best example of it they were settled Makkah when they

accepted Islam. The disbelievers used to torture them because they were easy targets. This is what Muhammad(PBUH) used to say to them, "Yasir's family, be patient, you will be awarded with paradise."

"And We will surely test you with something of fear and hunger and a loss of wealth and lives and fruits, but give good tidings to the patient, who when dist ster strikes them, say, 'Indeed we belong to Allah, and indeed to Him we will return.' Those are the ones upon whom are blessings from the Lord and mercy. And it is those who are the [rightly] guided."

These verses highlight that life's trials are tests from God, and those who remain patient and turn to Him will be rewarded and guided.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

"Won rous is the affair of the believer, for there is go d for him in every matter, and t is is not the case with anyone except the believer. If he is happy, then he thanks Allah and there is good for him; and if he is harmed, then he shows patience and there is good for him."

This Hadith emphasizes that believers find benefit in every situation, whether through gratitude or patience, strengthening their resilience.

5. Does not let a person get to immersed in this Life

"Know that the life of this world is but amusement and diversion and adornment and boasting to one another and competition in increase of wealth and children. Like the example of a rain whose [resulting] plant growth pleases the tillers; then it dries and you see it turned yellow; then it becomes [scattered] d bris. And in the Hereafter is severe punishment and forgiveness from Al ah and approval. And what is the worldly life except the enjoyment of delusion."

This verse contrasts the temporary nature of worldly life with the eternal consequences of he Hereafter, discouraging excessive attachment to worldly matters.

6. Makes person grateful

If no one in this world does good to you, you should also do good to him. You will not be awarded for this in this world .But believe in Hereafter keep me

motivated that on the Day of Judgment Allah almighty will definitely reward. That is, whatever a person does in this world, the intention behind is to pleased Allah. The anticipation of the Hereafter and acknowledgment of God's blessings fosters gratitude in individuals, as they recognize the ultimate purce of all good.

"And We had certainly given Luqman wisdom [and faid], 'Be grateful to Allah.' And whoever is grateful is grateful for hims af. And whoever denies [His favor] - then indeed, Allah is Free of ne d and Praiseworthy."

This verse encourages gratitude by highlighting that gratefulness benefits the individual and pleases God.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon 16m) said,

"He who does not thank people is not thankful to Allah."

This Hadith emphasizes the importance of gratitude, both towards people and towards God.

7. Helps stay steadfast in the actual purpose of this life

When all the above aspects become a part of our life the conclusive impact of all this would be that belief in Hereafter allows us to remain steadfast in achieving the actual purpose of life. "And I did not create the jinn and mankind except to worship Me."

The Prophet Muhan mad (peace be upon him) said,

"Whoever believes in Allah and the Last Day should speak good or keep silent."

This Hadith highlights the importance of aligning one's actions with the belief in God and the Hereafter, promoting steadfastness in purpose.

1. Helps in promoting justice

And if you distort [your testimony] or refuse [to give it], then indeed Allah is ever, with what you do, Acquainted."

This verse highlights the importance of being steadfast in justice, emphasizing that justice should be upheld even against one's own interests.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

"The just will be seated upon pulpits of light; those who are fair with regards to their judgment and their family and those who are under them."

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

3. Mutual Harmony

"And hold firmly to the rope of Allah all together and do not become divided. And you were on the edge of a pit of the Fire, and He saved you from it. Thus does Allah make clear to you His verses that you may be guided."

This verse calls for unity and harmony among believers, reminding them of God's favor in bringing them together.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

"The Muslim is the one from whose tongue and hand the Muslims are safe, and the believer is the one who is trusted with the lives and wealth of the people."

This Hadith emphasizes the importance of ensuring the safety and well-being of others and promoting harmonious relationships within the community.

4. Equality

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,
