Pakistan, for example, has the second highest number of out of school ^{children} (22.8 million) worldwide (Unicef, 2024) and has a poverty rate of nearly 40 percent, according to the World Bank. Comparatively, Japan, which places great emphasis over education, merely

has a poverty rate of 15 percent (Statista, 2021). Therefore, poverty is directly linked with the quality of education a nation provides to its citizens.

Lastly, education is the main determinant of the economic prosperity of a nation. Countries that attach great significance to education ensure that their citizens can not only operate and create new technologies, but are also able to critically plan for the future. Singapore, a country with a gross domestic product (GDP) per capita of over USD 82,000 allocated more than 13 percent of its GDP to education, with a special focus on
