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Introduction:

The term Islam derives from the three-letter Arabic root, "S(س)-L(ل)-M(م)" which generates words with interrelated meanings, including "Surrender", "Submission", "Commitment" and "Peace".

"Submission means that you should bear witness that there is no god but God and that Muhammad is God's messenger, that you should perform the ritual prayers, pay the alms tax, fast during Ramadan, and make the pilgrimage to the house if you are able to go there."

✎ In Hadith-e-jibraet, Holy prophet (P.B.U.H) said.

(i) To bear witness of Allah and his messenger.

(ii) To establish pillars and practice pillars of Islam."

✎ Doctor Hamid-ullah define Islam as:

"Islam is a monotheist deen revealed upon Prophet (P.B.U.H).

✎ According to Sadar-ud-din Islahi:

"Islam is the combination of two things.

Here are salient features of Islam

(i) Monotheism (Tauheed).

Islam emphasizes the belief in

Oneness of God.

In the Holy Quran Allah said

Say, 'He is Allah, (who is) One, Allah, the eternal refuge. He neither begets nor is born, nor is there to him any equivalent'

(Quran 112:1-4)

Prophet (P.B.U.H) said:

"Islam is like a fort and the gate of that fort is tauheed"

(ii) Prophethoods-

Islam recognize a line of prophets sent by God, including Adam, Noah, Jesus, Moses, Abraham and Muhammad (P.B.U.H).

In Quran, Allah said:

"Muhammad is not the father of (any) one of your men, but (he is) the messenger of Allah and the last of the prophets."

(Al-Quran 33:40)

In Surah-Al-Anbiya (The Prophet), Allah said.

"And we have not sent you, (O Muhammad), except as a mercy to the worlds"

Abdullah bin Mas'ud said:

(Sahih Bukhari).

(vi) Islamic law (Shariah).

Allah said in Quran

"And we have revealed to you, (O Muhammad), the book in truth, confirming that which preceded it of the scripture and as a criterion over it"

(Quran 5:48)

(vii) Day of judgment.

Islam teaches the belief in day of judgment

Does man think that we will not assemble his bones? Yes (we are) able to proportion his fingerprints/fingertips. (75:3-4)

(vii) Five pillars of Islam.

(i) ~~Shahada (Declaration of faith)~~. Salah.

"And establish prayer and give zakah and bow with those who bow"
(Quran 2:43).

(ii) Zakat (Almsgiving)

"And establish prayer and give zakah, and whoever good you put forward for yourselves - you will find it with Allah. Indeed, Allah of what you do, is seeing"
(Quran 2:210).

(iii) ~~Salah (Ritual prayer)~~. Shahada.

"There is no god but Allah, And Muhammad is the messenger of Allah"

(iv) Sawm (fasting in Ramadan).

"O you who have believed, decreed upon you is fasting as it was decreed upon those before you that you may become righteous"
(Quran 2:183).

(v) Hajj.

"And (due) to Allah from the people

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is a ^{pr} pilgrimage to the house. For whoever is able to find thereto a way"

(Quran 3:97).

(viii) Equality and justice.

Emphasis on equality and justice among... people.

"O you who have believed, be persistently standing firm for Allah, witness in justice, And do not let the hatred of people prevent you from being just. Be just; that is nearer to righteousness"

(Quran 5:8).

(ix) Respect for parents.

"Honor your father and mother, so that you may live long in the land (Your God) the Lord is giving you"

(Bible 20:12)

(x) Peace and Submission.

Islam means submission to the will of God and striving for peace.

"Indeed, Allah commands justice, good conduct, and giving to relatives, And he forbids immorality, bad conduct, and oppression. He admonishes you that perhaps you will be reminded.

(Quran 60:90)

(xi) The Quran.

Belief in the Quran as the literal word of God.

"This is the book about which there is no doubt, a guidance for those conscious of Allah"

(Quran 2:2).

(xii) Revelation (Wahy).

Islam teaches that God communicated His guidance through revelations.

"And this is a book which we have sent down, blessed and confirming what was before it, that you may warn the mother of cities and those around it"

(Quran 6:92).
